

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
March 10, 1930

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall, March 10 with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of February 10 were read and approved.

There was some discussion of the schedule for the final examinations for next year but no action was taken.

The following recommendations from the Committee on Duplication of Courses were approved:

- ✓ Political Science 190a-190b. A Seminar in Political Science. Open only to major students. One credit per semester.

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

1. "At its meeting of February 24, the faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences voted to recommend to the Senate that in reporting grades for independent work courses, teachers shall state on the grade card the topic of study pursued by the student in the course."

2. "At its meetings on January 23 and February 24, the faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences voted the following recommendation for changes in the requirements for the combined course:

1. In paragraph 2, page 35 of the University regulations insert after the second word, "before transferring to the professional school" so that the sentence will read: "He must before transferring to the professional school, have met the specified requirements of the College of Arts and Sciences, excepting the 20 credits in the major subject, and in the Arts-Medicine course, the required work in Hygiene."

2. Change paragraph 4 page 35 of the University regulations to read: The fourth year, the year of professional work must be done in a college of Law approved by the Association of American Law Schools or in a class A medical school."

The by-laws of the Board of Student Publications were approved as follows:

1. "The Board of Student Publications (hereafter called the Board) shall be composed of ten (10) members who shall each serve for the tenure of one year, the present Board being in effect the remainder of the session 1929-30. The Board shall annually be composed of the following members: The president, vice-president, and secretary of the University Men's Student Council; the president and vice-president of the University Women's Self-governing Association; the president, vice-president, and secretary of the Junior Class; and two faculty members of the Department of Journalism."

The student members shall automatically become members of the Board each year upon assuming the duties of their respective elective offices in their organizations. The faculty members shall be appointed each year by the Head of the Department of Journalism.

2. The Board shall be empowered to elect the editor, the managing editor, and business manager of the Kentucky Kernel.

3. Nominations for the positions of editor and business manager of the Kentuckian shall be made to the Board by petition, each petition to carry the signatures of thirty-five (35) bonafide junior students of the University. The Board shall pass on the qualifications of the said nominees and present such names as it may choose to the Junior Class which shall then ballot in regular election for the men whom they favor for these positions.

4. The Board, in regular session shall have power to remove any or all of the above named officers for cause.

5. The Editors of the Kentucky Kernel and the Kentuckian shall be permitted to attend all meetings of the Board, but shall not be entitled to vote upon any matters under consideration.

6. The Board shall have general supervisory power over all matters affecting student publications and final authority upon all financial matters of all student publications. The Board is empowered to decide what transactions are financial in determining jurisdiction.

7. Seven members met in duly authorized session shall be deemed to constitute a quorum, provided that no session shall be deemed authorized unless notices have been sent by the secretary twenty-four (24) hours in advance to each member of the Board

8. The Board shall have power to summon any person to obtain information upon all questions within its jurisdiction.

9. The Board shall have the right to demand financial reports affecting all publications under its control at such time or times as it may deem desirable.

10. In case any officer of any student publication finds himself in conflict with any other officer of the same, he shall have the right to present his grievance to this Board which shall have the power finally to adjudicate it.

11. The President of the Men's Student Council annually shall be Chairman of the Board, and the Secretary of the said Council annually shall be Secretary of the Board. The minutes and records of said Board shall be kept and properly filed.

12. The Board shall have power to amend its By-Laws, subject to the approval of the University Senate.

13. This instrument shall have full force and effect from the date of its approval by the Board.

14. This instrument shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board and shall become part of its permanent records from the date of its approval.

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
April 14, 1930

The University Senate met in the Lecture room of McVey Hall, Monday, April 14, with President McVey presiding.

The following courses and changes in courses recommended by the Committee on Duplication of Courses were approved:

College of Arts and Sciences

- ✓ English 138. Methods of Teaching the Use of the Library. (For juniors and seniors) 2 hours a week, 2 credits.
- ✓ English 132. Library Work with Children. (For juniors and seniors) 2 hours a week, 2 credits.
- ✓ English 139. Field Work. (For juniors and seniors) 2 hours a week, 2 credits.
- ✓ English 129. Cataloging and Classification. Two hours a week. Two credits. This course is to replace English 27.
- ✓ English 128. Children's Literature. Two hours a week. Two credits. This course is to replace English 28, Book Selection for Children.
- ✓ English 126. Place, Function, Administration and Opportunity of the Library in the Modern School. Two hours a week. Two credits. (This is a change in the title of the course, the original title being Library Methods for Teachers)
- ✓ Zoology 157a, b. Invertebrate Anatomy. Prerequisite Zoology 1a, b. Two hours recitation, four hours laboratory per week. Four credits.
- ✓ Bacteriology 52. Principles of Bacteriology. Prerequisites, must be preceded or accompanied by Chemistry 1b, lectures and recitations two hours, laboratory four hours a week. Four credits.
- ✓ Romance Languages 9a, b. Spanish Novel and Drama. Three hours per week. Three credits each semester. Prerequisites, two years of college Spanish or four year's high school Spanish.
- ✓ Zoology 7a, b. Comparative Anatomy. Four credits per semester. This course is to replace Zoology 107a, b.
