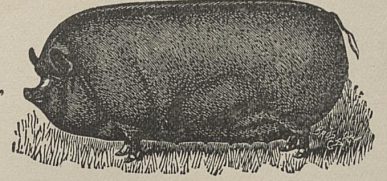

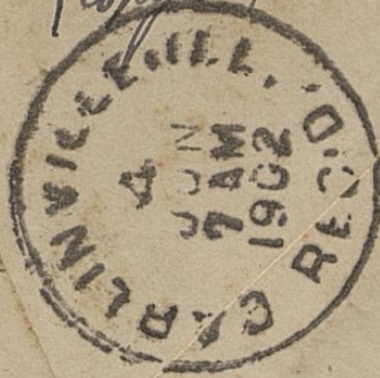

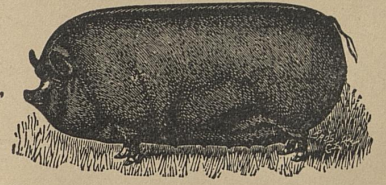

Mr. Bill Cole, Newville, Tenn.  
Friend Bill:-

I arrived in Carlinville the third day of February about 12 A.M. John met me at the depot and we went out to his place. The snow was about knee deep and we did not get there till about 2 o'clock in the morning. It is 7 miles south of Carlinville. I cut wood for John and some of his neighbors until <sup>Feb.</sup> March 14th. The tenth of ~~March~~ I hired to a man named Lovell until March 1st and went to work for him Feb. 14th and did not have quite 2 weeks there. The 11th of February John and I came up here, 6 miles northeast of Carlinville or 13 miles from John's place. That day I hired to C. H. C. Anderson & Co. for 8 months to commence March 1st. I get \$20.00 per month and board and washing. I came up here the evening of March 2nd and have worked 4 weeks. They also hire another man. The farm I am working on has 270 acres and



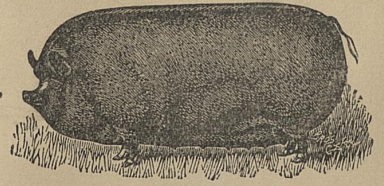
