Sept. 14, 1900

The meeting was called to order by President Patterson.

In the absence of the Secretary, Prof. Anderson was appointed Secretary pro tempore.

The first matter of business was the McKee petition

Moved by Major Carpenter that Mr McKee be allowed to enter college and be required to pursue calculus again in class. Seconded by Prof. Anderson. Motion lost

Prof. Brooks moved that Mr McKee be allowed to enter under the condition that all the work of the year be gone over. Second by Prof. Anderson.

Prof. Miller moved to lay the motion over until the next meeting of the faculty. Seconded by Prof. Brooks. Carried.

A petition from the K. S. C. Publishing Co. came up on motion of Prof. Patterson, seconded by Prof. Brooks.

The matter was referred to a committee consisting of McKenzie, Merricke, Roark and White

Prof. Patterson moved that Mr Campbell be restored to his position in the Battalion, seconded by Miller. Motion lost
