MINUTES OF THE SENATE JULY 5, 1922

The University Senate met in the Little Theater Tuesday, July 5, President McVey presiding.

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

- ✓ Anc. Lang. 201a - Pastoral Poetry, 3 credits
- ✓ Anc. Lang. 201b - Elegiac Poetry, 3 "

✓ Education 3a - Elementary Education. This course is designed for freshmen who are preparing to teach in the elementary schools. It embraces a survey of the elementary field, its aims and methods. Three hours a week. First semester.

✓ Education 3b - Continuation of 3a. Three hours a week. Second semester. Education 3a,b to replace Education 2.

✓ Education 15 - Administration and Supervision, 3 crs. To replace Education 15a,b.

Senate approved the following recommendation of the Rules Committee in regard to entrance requirements:

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

The units offered for admission to the freshman class must be taken from the list as given below. The numbers indicate the units that may be offered in each subject:

BASIC UNITS (Required by all colleges)

1. The following subjects are required for entrance by all colleges of the University:

III. In addition to the units required under I, a sufficient number of units to make a total of fifteen must be offered from Groups A and B, except that not more than four units may be offered from Group B.
