MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE JULY 13, 1925

The Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, July 13, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of May 28 were read and approved.

X { The recommendation of the Rules Committee, "That the Committee on Scholarship and Attendance be empowered to deduct from a student's semester's total number of credits and points for irregular attendance" was postponed until September.

The report of the special committee on Duplication of Work was called for and President McVey asked if anyone desired to have it read and considered at this time. No motion was made to consider the report and it was postponed to the September meeting.

The following recommendations of the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

- ✓ English 130a and 130b - Comparative Literature. Survey of masterpieces from Homer to the present day. Lectures, class discussions, assigned readings and written reports. 3 hrs. a week.
✓ Psychology 7 - Psychology of the Child. Pre-requisite an introductory course in psychology. 3 credits. Second semester.

Changes in numbers of Sociology courses made necessary by the organization of the College of Commerce:

- ✓ Sociology 51a-b - changed to 1a-1b.
✓ Sociology 151 - changed to 101
✓ Sociology 152 - changed to 102
✓ Sociology 153 - changed to 103
✓ Sociology 154 - changed to 104
✓ Sociology 155 - changed to 105
✓ Sociology 156 - changed to 106
✓ Sociology 159 - changed to 107
✓ Sociology 161 - changed to 108
✓ Sociology 251a-251b - changed to 201a, 201b

The following recommendation from the College of Agriculture was approved:

- ✓ A. I. 121 - Advanced Genetics - a course dealing with animal, plant and human genetics.. Prerequisite A.I. 119. Lectures, 3 hrs. First semester.

That Home Economics 42, Home Management, be made a prerequisite for the degree of B.S. in Home Economics.

The following recommendation from the College of Engineering was approved:

Civil Engineering 5 - Elements of Architecture - For seniors in Civil Engineering. Lecture and recitation one hour a week for the first semester; drawing room four hours a week, second half of first semester.

The following recommendations of the College of Commerce were approved:

- ✓ Economics 201, Advanced Economics - changed to Economics 203 - History of Economic Thought - 3 credits.
- ✓ Drop Economics 101 and Add - Economics 116 - Business Organization, 3 credits. and
- ✓ Add Economics 117 - Corporation Finance - 3 credits.

New Courses

- ✓ Economics 115 - Contemporary Economic Thought - 3 credits
- ✓ Economics 118 - Cost Accounting - 3 credits
- ✓ Economics 119 - Principles of Retailing - 2 credits
- ✓ Economics 120 - Commercial and Agricultural Organization - 3 crs.
- ✓ Economics 8 - Economic Geography - 3 credits.

Senate also approved the request of the College of Commerce to allow members of the class of 1926 to qualify for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Commerce by completing 30 credits in Commerce, 6 credits in English, 6 credits in a foreign language, 6 credits in a natural science, and a total of 127 credits, with a standing of one. This privilege is to be accorded to students who have had 15 credits or more in Economics.
