



No. 1. Tresscott Rifle Horn and Bag; this bag contains 2 brass military buttons of the early Colonial period.
 No. 2 is a very early Tomahawk made for the Indian trader, by early rifle smiths. It is made of soft iron, in 2 pieces, and welded together. This Tomahawk was found not many years ago in the Blue Mountain district of Pennsylvania, in the woods and almost on the surface. It is a rare piece.
 No. 3 is a flint-lock for starting fire. Very fine lint is placed in the receptacle in front of the hammer, the sparks falling in form a coal which is easily fanned into flames.
 No. 4. Barrel gauge by George Schall.
 No. 5. Unspun flax, used for swabbing bore.
 No. 6. Flint and steel firestriker.
