

A & M. College of Ky. Apr. 11-1902

A called meeting of the faculty was held in the President's room at 3 P.M. those present being President Patterson, Profs. White, Neville, W. K. Patterson, Kastle, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Brooks, Mackenzie and Kiler.

The purpose of the meeting as announced by Pres. Patterson, was to take steps to investigate the alleged assault upon Maj. M. Kee, and the alleged indignities offered to Mr. Denny B. Goode.

Some discussion was had upon the question whether the matter should be referred to the Board of Discipline first, or should be taken up at once by the entire faculty.

Upon motion of C. W. Mathews, seconded by Prof. Patterson, it was ordered that we proceed at once to the investigation of Mr. Goode's case.

Prof. Mackenzie presented a communication from the Knights Templar inviting the drum corps of the Battalion to accompany them upon an outing to Versailles upon some date in May.

Upon motion of Prof. Anderson seconded by Prof. Kastle, it was ordered that three cadets be allowed to go.

Adjourned to Monday Apr 14<sup>th</sup> 1902.
