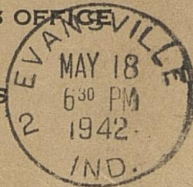

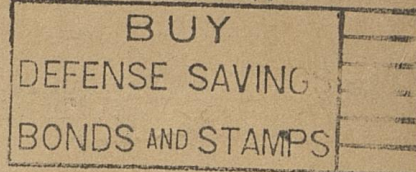

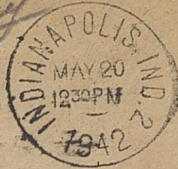

course I dont mo.

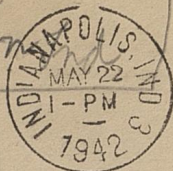

time write soon.



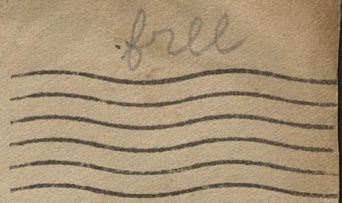
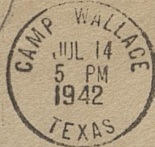
