

The following recommendations from the College of Engineering were approved:

- ↓ Mechanics of Engineering 12 (Automotive Engineering) changed to Mechanical Engineering 12 (Automotive Engineering).
- ↓ Mechanics of Engineering 8 (Graphics of Machines) changed to Mechanics of Engineering 10 (Graphics of Machines)

The following new organizations were authorized:

- Moles - Mining Fraternity, with plan to petition Sigma Rho, Nat. Frat.
- Alpha Delta Theta - social women's fraternity
- Delta Delta Delta - social women's fraternity
- Pi Alpha Theta - social women's fraternity
- Phi Mu Alpha (Sinfonia) Fraternity - musical fraternity.

The Senate also approved the organization of a women's Athletic Association, upon presentation of a petition signed by 100 women students.

The Senate then adjourned to meet May 29, to consider the recommendations of the Rules Committee.

SENATE OF MAY 29, 1922 ✓

The University Senate met Monday, May 29, in continuation of the meeting of May 22. Not having a quorum present, the following recommendations of the Rules Committee were approved, subject to further approval of the Senate in a full meeting.

"That changes in prescribed work shall be effective in any student's course when the changes are made in the part of the course which he has not yet taken.

p. 27 - Recitation Hours

First line changed to read: "No classes for freshmen and sophomores are to be scheduled for the fifth hour Tuesday."

Last line changed to read: "Chapel shall be held at the fifth hour Tuesday."

p. 28 -  
Change in Classification

Add: "This does not apply to changes made on the initiative of a dean."

p. 29 -  
Requirements Holding in all Colleges

Last line changed to read: "At least the senior year must have

been in residence. Two summer schools shall be considered equivalent to one semester in the residence requirement."

Graduation in the College of Law changed to Admission to the College of Law.

Omit first paragraph.

Add: "For admission to the College of Law the student must present, in addition to fifteen entrance units, at least thirty credits of college work other than law, exclusive of military science or physical education." Six of these thirty must be in English."

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Definition of a Credit

In the third line, omit "military drill."

Begin first line with the phrase: "When not otherwise specified."

Definition of Standing

Substitute for: "When a semester's work is to be considered": "In connection with the rules governing probation and transfer from another college to Arts and Sciences."

Undergraduate Honors

Second line, "2" changed to "2.2"

Commencement Honors

Add after "c":

"d. A student may receive the appropriate commencement honors who attains a standing of two-tenths greater than the above named for his last two years."

Credits Permitted in Each Semester changed to Minimum Credits to be Carried.

In first line, omit "except the College of Law". Change "14" to "12"

Extra Work

Change to Read: "To be eligible to carry extra hours of work, a student must have attained in the preceding semester a standing of at least 2. Students with a standing of 2 may be assigned extra work (not to exceed three hours) by the Dean of their college."

Required Work Takes Precedence - to be omitted.

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Transfer from One College to Another - to be omitted. ✓

Transfer from Special Student to Regular

Change to read: "A special student may, if recommended by the faculty of his college for the privilege, be graduated as a regular student upon either of the following conditions:

1. If he has a standing of 1.5, extra college credits may be substituted for entrance deficiencies at the rate of two semester credits for each entrance unit not yet satisfied.

2. If he has made a standing of 2.4 for the course, he will be graduated without being required to make up his entrance deficiencies."

Delinquent Students changed to Reports on Unsatisfactory Scholarship and Attendance

Change first paragraph to read: "Students who are doing unsatisfactory work, or who are irregular in attendance, are reported to the Registrar, who arranges the names by colleges and presents them to the Council. Such a student is put under the special supervision of his Dean. If after a suitable length of time it becomes apparent that no improvement is being made, the student is reported by the Dean to the Committee on Scholarship and Attendance."

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Classification

First paragraph made to read: "A student to be considered a member of the senior class in any year, shall have at the beginning of the collegiate year a standing of one, and shall have the number of credits required of him for graduation less eight more than twice the number he is allowed to carry the first semester of the senior year." A student who is allowed to carry sufficient work the second semester to bring him within eight credits of graduation shall be eligible for senior classification the second semester."

Omit second and third paragraphs. ✓

Last paragraph made to read: "A student, to be classified as a junior, must have within nine credits of the normal amount of work, and a standing of one; to be classified as a sophomore he must have within ten credits of the normal amount, with a standing of one."

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Add: Committee on Scholarship and Attendance

"A Senate committee, composed of one member from each college, with the deans of men and of women as ex-officio members, shall be constituted to consider cases of students delinquent in studies or attendance referred

to it by the Deans of Colleges, and to consider the appeals for reinstatement of students dropped for unsatisfactory work."

Add: "Penalty for Cheating

"All cases of cheating in University class work, ~~or cheating on examinations,~~ must be reported to the Discipline Committee. The least penalty shall be suspension for one semester."

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Excuses for Absences

Add: to last paragraph: "Requests for exemption from the penalty for absence before or after holidays must be presented to the Council within two weeks after return to the University."

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Absences

Second paragraph: "When a student has been absent from a class consecutively for the number of times the class is scheduled per week, the instructor shall notify the registrar, upon a form furnished for the purpose, and the student must obtain a reinstatement card from the Registrar before returning to the class.

The Registrar shall report the absence to the student's dean and notify the student to report to his dean, who shall investigate the case and advise action under one of the following heads:

1. To the Registrar that the student continue in the course.
2. To the Registrar that the student be dropped from the course.
3. Report the case to the Discipline Committee.

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Permission for Athletic Contests

Change to: "No group of University students, other than Varsity teams, shall engage in athletic games with an outside organization without the consent of the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences."

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Requirements - Drop, as being superfluous in the Rules.

Credit in Military Science for Ex-service men

Substitute "Military Science" for "Drill".

Weekly Convocation

Change to read: "All members of the freshman and sophomore classes

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are required to attend these exercises.

Numbering of Courses

Change to read: "All primarily undergraduate courses shall be numbered from 1-100; all undergraduate and graduate courses shall be numbered from 101-200; all strictly graduate courses shall be numbered from 201 on; The first half of a year course shall be indicated further by the letter a; the second half shall be indicated by the letter b; all one semester courses shall be indicated by number only."

Senate adjourned to meet Monday, June 5.

MINUTES OF THE SENATE JUNE 5, 1922

The University Senate met Monday, June 5, in continuation of the meeting of May 29. Quorum present.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved with slight modification in the paragraph "Penalty for Cheating." The phrase was added: "or cheating in examinations."

The Senate approved the schedule of classes for the eighth period in an emergency, provided it be recommended by the Dean of the College.

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

✓ 73. Legislative Procedure. A course dealing with the rules of the Kentucky General Assembly, with practice in Parliamentary exercises. One hour a week. First semester. Professor Jones. Credit .3.

✓ 75a. Legislative Drafting. A course in preparing, drafting and criticizing various laws of a legislative character. Admission is granted only with the approval of the instructor. One hour a week. First semester

✓ 75b. Legislative Drafting. A continuation of Course 75a. One hour a week. Second semester. "

The Senate approved the following rules, recommended by the Social Committee:
