MINUTES OF THE FACULTY.

The faculty met in regular session at 3:30 P. M., those present being President Barker, Vice President White, Professors Brown, Boyd, Chalkley, Davis, Dantzler, Easton, Farquhar, Freeman, Gillis, Hamilton, Healey, Jones, Kelly, Eafferty Mathews, Maxson, Melcher, Miller, Peter, Rowe, Sweetland, Tuttle, Turner, Tuthill, Tigert, and Zembrod.

The minutes of the last two meetings were read and upon motion approved.

Dean Miller presented to the faculty the name of Geo. T. Fuller as a candidate for the degree of A. B. to be conferred at the winter meeting of the board of trustees. On motion of Vice President White, duly seconded it was ordered that Mr. Fuller be so recommended to the board of trustees at the winter meeting.

The reports of standing committees were then called for in order.

Vice President White in behalf of the committee on examinations stated informally that it was planned to have the first hour class examinations on Friday, Dec. 13th, and other classes to follow in their usual order. Prof. Zembrod for the committee on entertainments non athletic reported that the dances which had been held since the last meeting of the faculty, at which action was taken sustaining the rules of the committee, had been carried out very satisfactory in accordance with the rules referred to, and had been closed promptly at the required hour. He further expressed his appreciation of the reinforcement of authority afforded to the committee by the action of the faculty at this last meeting. For the committee on student organization Dr. Pryor reported that since the last meeting of the faculty he had had a conference with the members of the Pan Hellenic council which he thought had been helpful in promoting a better understanding between the faculty and the fraternities. In this connection Dean Hamilton asked for advice regarding the purpose of the order of the faculty at the last meeting, sustaining the committee on entertainments regarding the conduct of dances. The question had arisen if the dances referred to include all dances of every character given under the auspices of the various fraternities connected with the After an informal discussion it was ordered on motion of Prof. Miller that the dances referred to in the regulations of the faculty and committee on entertainments, include all dances given in the name of any organization which is recognized by this University,

Prof. Melcher on behalf of the committee on College

schedules reported that work was progressing upon this matter, but that the committee was not yet ready for report.

On motion the committee adjourned.
