Faculty met. All present except Prof. Neville, R.R. Bowling was cited to appear for refusing to perform military duty.

As a result of much discussion the following resolution was adopted: That in view of ~~his~~ his explanation to the Faculty we excuse him for his neglect to obey the order of Mr. Seale, the Officer of the Day, but that in future he must be careful to obey such orders, and if he judge any of them to be oppressive, he must report to the President and be guided by his judgment.

On motion of Prof. Peter a committee of three, viz; Profs. Peter, White and Kirby, was appointed to examine and report such amendments to the Regulations as thought desirable.

The action by which Mr. Lee was dismissed was reconsidered and after further discussion he was acquitted as to a specific violation of a certain part of a paragraph in the Regulations and the further consideration of his case was postponed.

The Board of Discipline offered a report for the consideration of the Faculty providing for the punishment of students for offenses not meriting dismissal or expulsion:

The report was adopted and is as follows:

1 For punishment for offenses not meriting dismissal or expulsion from College, demerits shall be given as follows:—

Absence from Chapel exercises	1	demerit.
Absence from recitation	1	"
Noise in building	1-5	"
Disobeying Sentinel	2-5	"
Neglect of Studies	2-10	"
Other Offenses	2-10	"

2 All excuses and explanations on the part of students must be in writing, if required by

any Professor commands; those for absence from Chapel must be handed to the Secretary, of the Faculty, and those for absence from recitation to the Professor in charge of the class and all others to Prof. McFarland.

3 When the excuses from chapel or recitation are not fully satisfactory the Prof. will report the student to Prof. McFarland who will record the number of demerits imposed by the foregoing regulations or by the Board of Discipline.

4 At the end of each week, each Prof. will report to Prof. McFarland all cases of unexcused absence, neglect of studies or other offenses having occurred in class.

5 When a student shall have received during one month fifteen demerits or during one term fifty demerits, notice of this fact as well as of the substance of the following clause will be given to the parents or guardian by the President.

6 When a student shall have received during one month twenty demerits or during one term seventy five demerits he shall be dismissed from the College.
