see you.

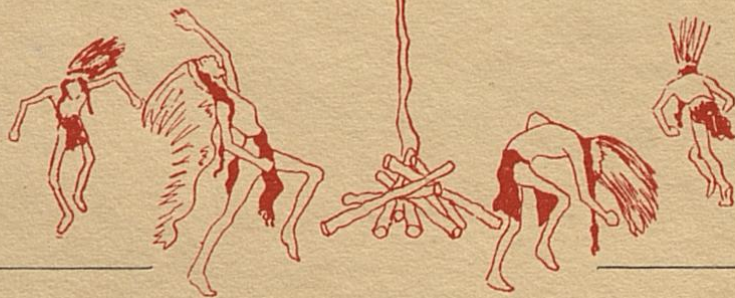

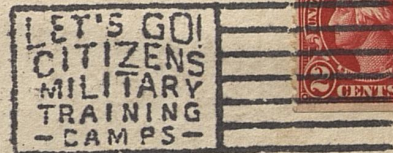
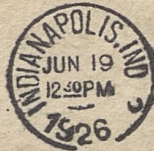
Dear Edna:

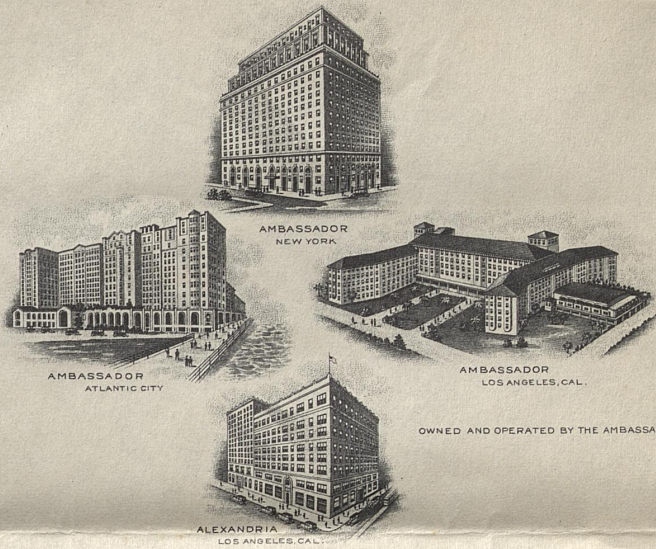
