Faculty met in called session at 1 P.M. in the President's room. Present: President Patterson, Prof. Shackleford, Schweinitz, Crandall, W. H. Patterson, Potter, Logan, Pence, White, Helvetz and Col. Clark. Col. Clark stated that the Cadet Companies have been so thinned out in numbers that it was impossible to drill them properly. The cadets working on the farm having been excused from drills heretofore, it was ordered that all cadets, whether working or not, must hereafter drill at least two hours per week, the days to be fixed by Col. Clark (Tuesday and Friday). Several proposals to change the hour for drills having, on examination, been found impossible to introduce at this time, the hour for drills was left unchanged.

H. E. Curtis R. Payne & J. V. Bartlett and Miss Belle
C. Gunn, having creditably finished the course prescribed
for the degree of Bachelor of Science, it was unanimously
resolved to recommend them to the Board of Directors
for that degree. - On motion and the Faculty having
expressed their opinion, it was resolved to request the
Board of Directors to restore the former rating of the
final examination, to count one half in the making
up of the final standing of the student the present
mode of rating, introduced last year, having been
found unsatisfactory. - Prof. J. F. White Chairman
of the Committee on revision of the course of studies,
reports that so far no satisfactory result has been
obtained. On motion the Committee is continued with
instructions to confer with the Executive Committee
during vacation. - Mr. Thos H. Morgan, a graduate
of this College and for two years a student of Johns
Hopkins University, Baltimore, Md. applies for
the degree of Master of Science. After consultation
the Faculty unanimously resolved to recommend
him to the Board of Directors for that degree.
Prof. J. F. White and J. M. Helveti having withdrawn
on request, Prof. John Shaeferford moved that they
both be recommended to the Board of Trustees for the
degree of Master of Arts. The motion was duly
seconded and carried.
