Minutes of the General Faculty.

The General Faculty convened in its customary place at 3:40 P. M. Friday Sept. 20th, 1912, and was called to order by President Barker. The following members were present, constituting more than the number required as a quorum:-

President Barker, Vice President White, Prof. Anderson, Miller, Rowe, Lafferty, Hamilton, Mackenzie, Pryor, Garman, Pence, Zembrod, Tuttle, Frankel, Maxson, Jones, Peter, Curtis, Allen, Turner, Good, Roberts, Brown, Kastle, Mustaine, Noe, Melcher, Tuthill, Freeman, Commandant Kelly, Prof. Boyd, Davis, Carrel, Strauss and Gillis.

On motion of Dean Lafferty, seconded by Dean Rowe, the Faculty dispensed with the reading of the minutes of June 4th., 1912.

A Committee on Recognition, for the proper reception of new members of the Faculty, was filled by the President's announcement of the following: Chairman, Vice-President White, Messrs. Mackenzie, Freeman, Allen, Pryor and Miss. Hamilton.

The Military Committee offered, through its Chairman the Commandant, oral report on the adoption and printing of the rules governing the members of the University battalion. It was explained that the Board had authorized the printing of the rules prior to their adoption by the General Faculty. After some discussion, it was moved by Mr. Allen, and duly seconded that the adoption of the Committee's report be deferred until the regular Faculty Meeting, thus giving opportunity for individual Professors to scrutinize the provisions of the rules. This motion prevailed.

The reading of the minutes of the Council was likewise postponed.

A report by the Commandant on the question of the requirements in military science for students who are obliged to earn their way through College, was referred without objection to the Military Committee, by President Barker, with instructions to report at the next meeting.

Dean Miller reported that two seniors would probably have sufficient credits to graduate in December 1912, thus completing the course in three and a half years, and omitting the required English lectures in the spring. Dean Miller reported a noticeable tendency on the part of some students to forge ahead of their classes and thus undermine class unity. With unanimous consent President Barker referred this question to the Committee of Deans for further consideration and formal report. Adjourned.
