Dean White presented for the College of Arts and Sciences three recommendations. The first was for a new course, which was approved by the Faculty.

1. That the following course be added:

Physics 8. General Physics for Students in Agriculture and Home Economics. (4)

A general elementary course summarizing in one semester the main features of a two semester course in physics. Five hours a week; recitation and laboratory. Prereq: College algebra; registration in the College of Agriculture and Home Economics.

The other recommendations were as follows:

- 2. That the President of the University of Kentucky be requested to lay before the Council on Public Higher Education, of which he is a member, a request that the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences of the University of Kentucky be appointed to the Advisory Committee of the Council on Public Higher Education.
- 3. That a study of the operation of Section 5, page 1129, Commonwealth of Kentucky Educational Bulletin, Vol. XIX, No. 11 (January 1952) be made by a subcommittee of the Advisory Committee to the Council on Public Higher Education, and that the President of the University of Kentucky be asked to lay the request for this study before the Council on Public Higher Education.

Dean White asked Dr. Cone, Chairman of the Arts and Sciences Committee which prepared these recommendations, to explain their purpose. Dr. Cone reviewed the structure of the Council on Public Higher Education and stated that his committee felt that the Dean of their college should be represented on the Advisory Committee, in view of the fact that students preparing for certification as teachers took a large percentage of their program in the College of Arts and Sciences. The section of the Bulletin of the Department of Education referred to in the second recommendation reads as follows:

"5. Any person presenting a teaching area may qualify to teach an additional subject by presenting 12 semester hours in that subject. The addition of 12 semester hours to the face of any certificate to take place only in cases where the applicant has fulfilled the requirements in general education."

President Donovan stated that he and Dean Dickey would be glad to present the requests to the Council on Public Higher Education.

Associate Dean Horlacher presented for the College of Agriculture and Home Economics recommendations concerning dropped and added courses which were approved by the Faculty.

### Drop

Agronomy 1, Elementary Farm Crops; Agronomy 10, Soils; and Agronomy 11, Soils Laboratory.

# Substitute the following:

Agronomy 5, Introduction to Agronomy. (3)
The interrelation of soil, plant diseases and crop production.
Lecture, discussion and demonstration, three hours.

Agronomy 6. Principles of Field Crop Production (3)

Accourse in scientific fundamentals underlying the production of cereal, fiber, forage and tobacco crops. Lecture, two hours; lab, two hours. Prereq: Agron. 5; Bot. 1 or approval of the instructor.

Agronomy 61, Soils (4)
A general study of soil properties and processes with emphasis upon their influence on soil management. Lecture and discussion, three hours; lab, two hours. Prereq: Agron 5; or approval of the instructor; Prereq or concurrent: Chemistry 1b or 4b

Dean Dickey presented for the College of Education a recommendation concerning a new course and a change in course which was approved by the University Faculty.

Education 50. PLANNING A CAREER IN EDUCATION.
General Orientation to the teaching profession; emphasis
is given to choosing the level or field of teaching and developing plans for meeting certification requirements. (1 semester
hour)

Change of Title and Number of Course with Modification in Course Description

Educa.35. INTRODUCTION TO EDUCATION (2 semester hours) to be changed to:
Education 51. THE TEACHER IN AMERICAN SCHOOLS.
Topics include: the school in a democratic society, the
teacher, the learner, the educative process, legal aspects
of education, and history of education. (2 semester hours).

President Donovan reviewed the Commencement weekend activities and urged that all members of the faculty be present at these functions.

The President spoke briefly to the Faculty of the problems of parking at the University and outlined some of the groundwork which had been laid in providing for adequate parking. He called on the faculty to help in this major project which was under study by the Board of Trustees and the administration.

The Chairman introduced Mr. Don Whitehouse, 1955-56 President of the Student Government Association, and welcomed him to the University Faculty meetings.

The President stated that Mrs. Donovan and he would be away from the University during the summer and that during his absence Vice President Chamberlain would act as President of the University and any item of business should be taken up with Dr. Chamberlain. He extended to the Faculty wishes for a delightful summer.

The Faculty adjourned.
