My Dear Sir,

My brother Walter who had a bill to hand to you for sundry appropriations failed to see you before leaving Frankfort this afternoon.

I therefore enclose it. I also enclose a bill for an appropriation to liquidate our indebtedness of the College amounting to \$5925 - growing out of two causes as recited in the bill viz: (1) The impairment of the Medical fund derived from the U.S. Government to the extent of \$5000 annually and (2) The continued expansion and growth of the College. The two bills are fastened together.

Kelce has the bill for the Female dormitory and promised to have a type written copy of it made and handed to you in the morning.

But he should forget to enclose a copy of that also. I have my doubts about this latter, whether it will not be necessary

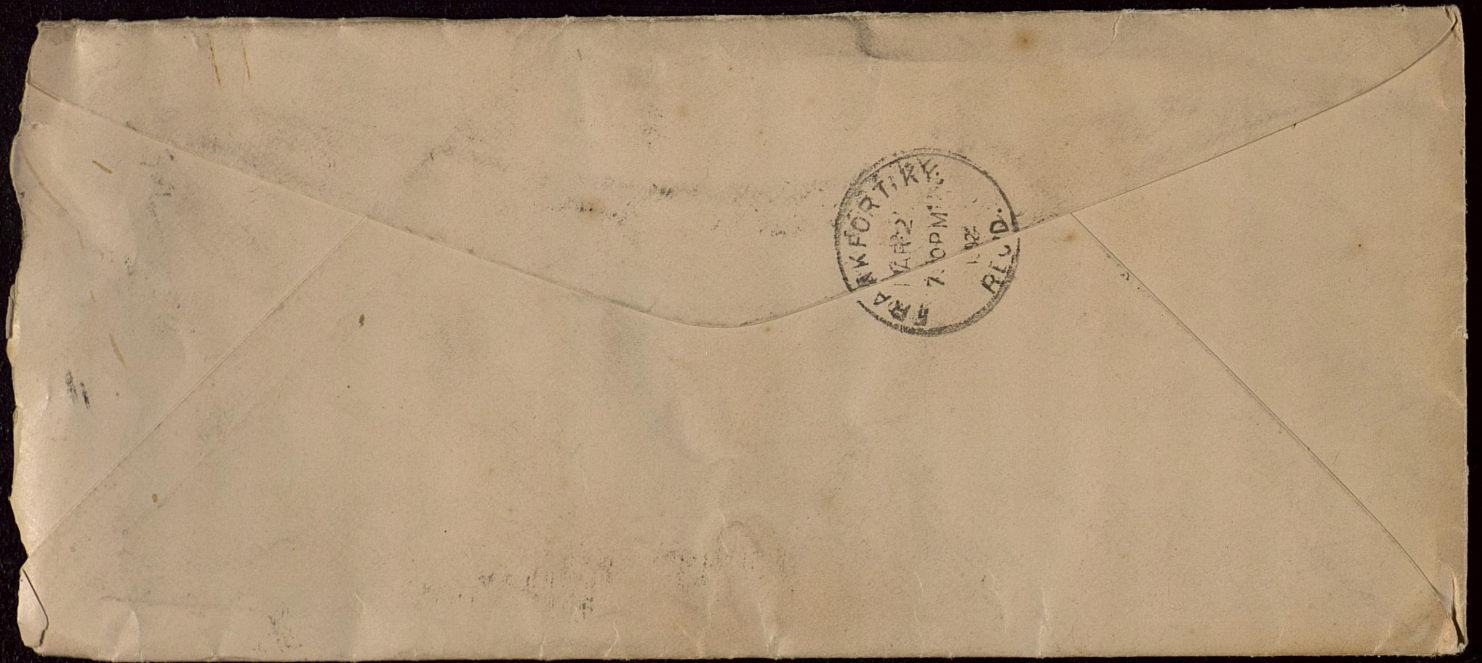

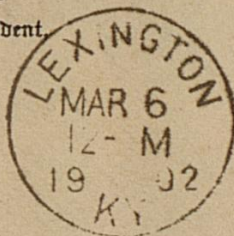

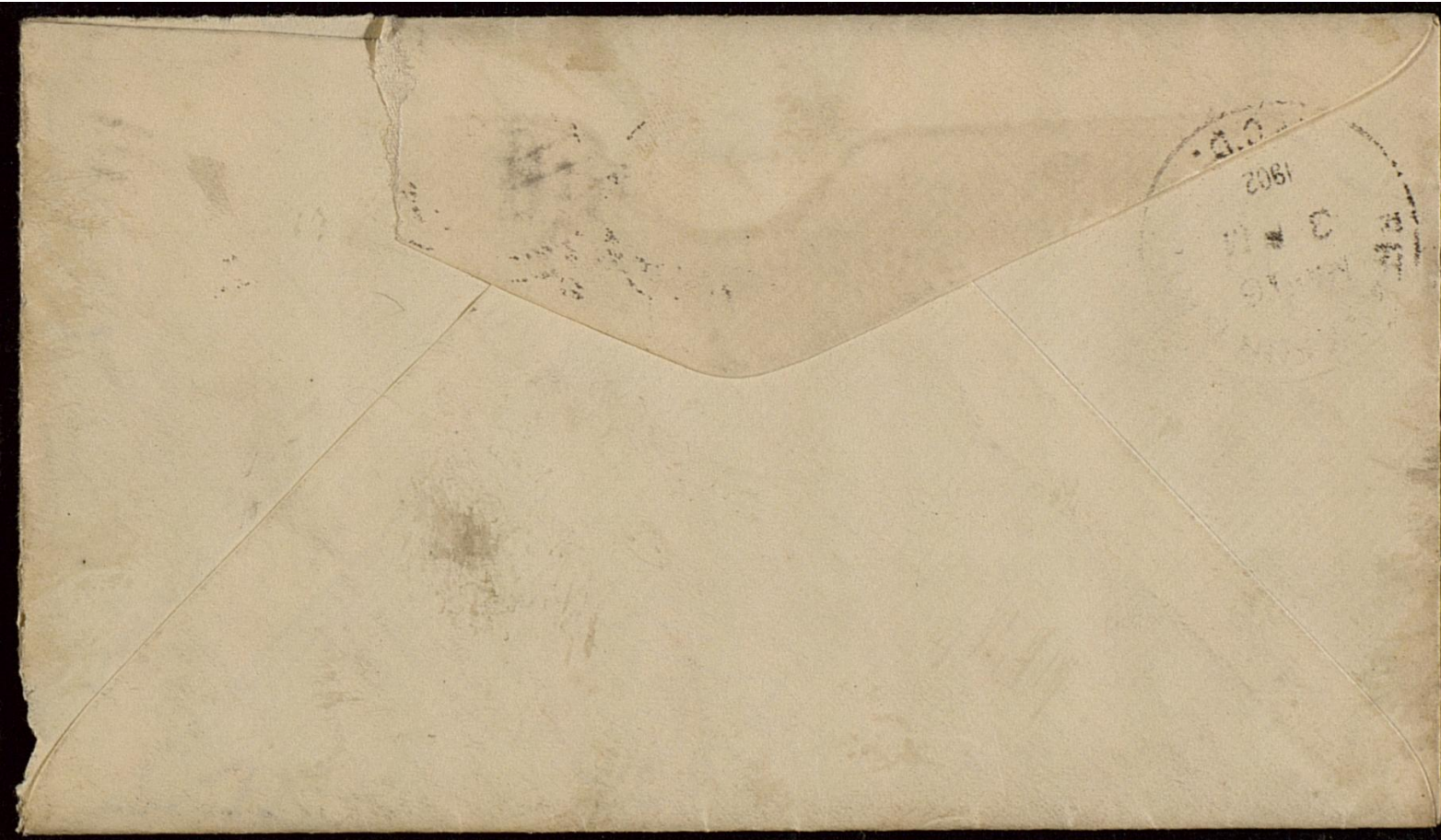
