The Faculty met as usual.
 Permission was given Mr. Post to instruct a class in Telegraphy
 provided it would not interfere with any of his college duties.
 Mr. Erwin asked permission to work in town during his
 leisure hours. Permission was granted. Mr. Atherton
 asked to be excused from drill on account of poor health,
 and also that he may have more time to devote to his studies.
 Considering the drill as a healthy exercise his request was
