The Faculty met at the usual hour. The request of J. F. Webster to be excused ^{from} German was referred to the President and the Instructor in German. For disrespectful conduct toward Prof. Hermon, A. Desha's general conduct was reduced 15% and he was required to receive a private reprimand from the President. Mr. Throp having for some time absented himself from his classes and work was directed to procure from Dr. Smith a written statement that he should be excused from his duties on account of his health. Messrs Jones and Trumbo accounted satisfactorily for their absence from Chapel. Optimal attendance on Chapel for the future was granted to Mr. Trumbo. Mr. Coleman was required to bring a note from his father in regard to his absence from Chapel. Lovelick's general conduct was reduced 10% for absence from Chapel. The Secretary was directed to write to A. L. Forrester's guardian, stating that his ward's conduct and progress are not satisfactory to this Faculty and that unless he change in these respects he will be dishonorably dismissed. An honorable discharge was granted to J. L. Ballard. Gubank having been guilty of disrespectful conduct toward Mr. Walter was told that if he does not do better he will be sent away. A committee consisting of President Dutton and Col. Swigart was appointed to see that the police law is carried out in case of students boarding at the Regents, and to express the protest of the Faculty against the special privileges granted them. The minutes of the last meeting were read and ^{approved} accepted. On motion the Faculty adjourned.
