According to the present contract between
the bookstore and the Board of Trustees, the
school annually receives 7½ per cent of the gross
profits. Since the store sells its books at 20 per
cent above list price, this leaves it a gross profit
of 12½ percent, out of which Mr. Morris pays
all light and heating bills, salaries, taxes, and
insurance receiving.

It is this annual payment to the University that we will list as point number one in our argument. The fact is that this amount, small though it may be, is regarded by the school as a certain source of revenue, which, if abolished, would have to be replaced by some other means. The most logical compensation, disagreeable though it might be to an institution whose policy it is to keep academic fees at a minimum, would be to raise tuttion costs. Thus nothing tangible would be gained by the students if this portion of the profits were done away with.

If, on the other hand, the bookstore's share of the profits were aboilsted, some method would have to be found to pay those costs now borned by Mr. Morris. These, obviously, would necessitate the collection of a co-op membership ferom each student, giving him little, if any, actual saving.

The other most justifiable grievance held by the student body against the bookstore—and one, incidentally, which is not the store's fault—is the compulsory purchase of textbooks written by local professors. It is bad enough, it seems for us, for any instructor to ask a student to accept him as the nation's foremost authority on a particular subject; it is even worse to force a student to spend money on "new editions," which are "new" only to the extent of the last few chapters (which nine times out of ten enever got around to in the ourse anyway).

(Perhaps this situation could be corrected by the passage of a University ruling that textbooks may be changed only with the consent of the college deans.)

Connected with this latter injustice is the practice of requiring students to buy expensive supplies and equipment for the sake of standardization, when more inexpensive types will serve the purpose. This obviously, is simple to correct.

And Mr. Morris' bookshop is one place at least on the campus where we have always received good service.
