March 6 The Faculty met in Pres. Patterson's room.

Mays, Rull Timberlake and Lewis Mulligan having been summoned appeared before the Faculty and on examination it was believed that they did not tell the whole truth concerning their misconduct and for refusing to do so on motion J. C. Mays and Rull Timberlake were dismissed and Lewis Mulligan was to suffer such discipline and the Board should see fit to impose.

A communication was received from Mr. J. A. Shackelford concerning his selection to deliver the Validictory declining to accept the honor.
