NEH SUMMER STIPENDS AVAILABLE

Each year the NEH awards several hundred summer research stipends to university faculty. Both junior and senior faculty members are eligible for the program. NEH Summer Stipends provide support for faculty and staff members in universities and in two-year and four-year colleges; for staff members in libraries, museums, and historical societies; for independent scholars; and for other people working in the humanities so that they can devote two consecutive months of full-time study and research to their projects. An applicant's project may be one that can be completed during the stipend tenure, or it may be part of a long-range endeavor.

Projects supported by NEH Summer Stipends contribute to scholarly knowledge, to the conception and substance of individual courses in the humanities, or to the general public's understanding of the humanities. Projects may address broad topics or consist of study and research in a specialized field. The NEH not only considers projects in the traditional humanities disciplines, but also funds projects in the social sciences and law that have humanistic content or focus.

The stipend is \$3750 for two months of summer research.

Over the past decade, thirteen UK faculty members' proposals have been funded by the NEH Summer Stipend program.

This year the University will nominate three proposals for the national competition. Faculty are encouraged to apply. Before applicants draft their proposals, they should pick up a copy of the 1991 application guidelines from Kathleen M. Blee, Associate Dean of Arts and Sciences. Interested faculty should submit a proposal and a curriculum vitae to Dr. Blee's office. The deadline for submission is Thursday, September 13, 1990. The proposal should follow the application guidelines and should be written to appeal to educated nonspecialists. A faculty committee will evaluate each proposal and select the three to be submitted to the NEH.
