Con't Minutes of the University Senate, February 7, 1966

Dean Kirwan presented a recommendation from the Graduate Council to award the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws to the speaker at the Founders Day Convocation of February 22, 1966. The Senate approved the recommendation as presented for recommendation to the Board of Trustees with the understanding that the name of the recipient be withheld pending action of the Board and acceptance by the recipient.

The Vice Chairman urged members of the Senate to attend the social hour and dinner being given in their honor by President and Mrs. Oswald and members of the Board on Monday evening, February 21st.

President Oswald stated that it was hoped that this first social event in honor of the University Senate would become an annual event of the Founders Day celebration. The President presented a brief history of the steps taken which led to the Central Campus Development Plan and introduced Mr. Larry Coleman, the University Planner, who, through the use of visual charts, traced the planning which provided the three-dimensional framework for the development of the Central Campus.

Dean Dake presented the following resolution from the College of Nursing on the death of Dr. May Sanders, Assistant Dean, with the recommendation that the Resolution be spread upon the minutes of the University Senate and that a copy be sent to the family with expression of deepest sorrow. The Senate stood for a moment of silent tribute in acceptance of the Resolution.

On February 4, 1966, the University, the nursing profession, and particularly the College of Nursing lost, through death, a highly esteemed and valued friend and colleague.

Dr. May M. Sanders joined the College of Nursing as assistant dean in September 1961, the second year of the College's operation. Until the fall of 1965, when ill health intervened, she provided intellectual challenge and leadership which contributed immeasurably to the development of a unique and progressive baccalaureate curriculum for nursing. That the program received high praise from the national accrediting body is a tribute to the quality of her contribution.

The University of Kentucky shares the loss of this capable nurse educator with the nursing profession at large and particularly with other southern states. A native of Texas, Dr. Sanders completed her basic preparation for nursing at King's Daughters Hospital in Temple, Texas. She taught in and/or directed hospital and baccalaureate programs in nursing in Texas, Georgia, and Tennessee. In each state she contributed generously of her time and talents to the activities of her church, civic organizations, and nursing associations.

The loss of her creative, intellectual challenge is great and those privileged to associate with her will also deeply miss her effervescent sense of humor.

Con't Minutes of the University Senate, February 7, 1966

May Sanders was a teacher of all those who would learn. Cognizant of the deficits of her initial preparation for nursing, she completed her baccalaureate degree at age 43. Still concerned for improvement in nursing education, she completed her Doctor of Education degree after the age of 50 at great personal and financial sacrifice. These and other accomplishments were achieved despite an unfortunate physical handicap which limited her mobility. She was dedicated to the fullest contribution of her God-given intellect even in the final stages of her life.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the College of Nursing does hereby officially recognize the contribution of Dr. May Sanders and does further express its deep sorrow at her untimely death.

The faculty of the College of Nursing recommends that this Resolution be spread upon the minutes of the University Senate and that a copy be sent to the family with expression of deepest sorrow.

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING, UNIVERSITY SENATE
March 7, 1966

The University Senate met in special session at 4:00 p.m., Monday, March 7, 1966, in the Student Center Theatre. Chairman Pellegrino presided. Ninety-six members were present.

President Oswald reported on House Bill 238, a copy of which had been distributed to each of the Senate members present. He expressed the hope that those present would take the opportunity to answer questions of all faculty who are not members of the Senate.

As background for the enactment, to become effective June 20, 1966, the President stated that in the spring of 1963 the Council on Public Higher Education authorized the state colleges to initiate work in the arts and sciences at the masters level. Concern was voiced as to the implication of this action on graduate work at the University of Kentucky. On his assumption of the presidency in the fall of 1963, he took the position that an over-all look should be taken at higher education in Kentucky, a long-range plan developed, and that there should be establishment of an agency to coordinate such a plan. In direct response to federal legislation which provided support for higher education, provided there was long-range planning and organization, the Governor appointed a Commission on Higher Education composed of the presidents of the six public institutions, the presidents of
