Charges against Cadets
 Camps, Stays, Cardy.

Faculty met in called meeting at 12 M. in the President's room. All present. Cause of meeting: Investigation of charge of intoxication and bringing intoxicating drinks into the College grounds and Dormitory, preferred against Cadets W. H. Camp, J. S. Stays and W. L. Cardy. The case was referred to the Faculty by the B. O. D. The accused appeared before the Faculty one at a time and one and all admitted the truth of the charge stated. Prof. W. H. Patterson moves that they be publicly reprimanded and that the propriety of their further stay at the Dormitory be referred for decision to the Dormitory Board. The motion is seconded by Prof. Sharpleford. Prof. Kastle agrees by moving that they publicly reprimanded, put under arrest for 4 weeks and walk post duty one hour every day for the same period (Sundays excepted) Prof. W. H. Patterson called for the ayes and Nays on the amendment. The call is seconded. The vote being 5 ayes, resulted in ten ayes for and four Nays for the amendment.
