

A.M. College of Kentucky Nov. 2-1906.

The faculty met in the president's room at 3.30 P.M. those present being Pres. Patterson, professors Neville, Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Mackenzie, Nowood, M. White, Wilson, Tuttle, Gumbrod, and Rowe. The minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved.

*Delinquencies in Gymnasium work.* After reading a communication from Prof. W. W. H. Mustaine calling attention to delinquencies on the part of certain junior students in their gymnasium work. The secretary was instructed to write to each of the delinquents informing them of the consequences of neglect of gymnasium work. Dr. Pryor called attention to the fact that two of the men named, Messrs J. H. Powell and D. K. Hutchcraft were excused from gymnasium work.

Prof. Mackenzie called attention to the fact that some students of the college are permitted to go through <sup>their course</sup> colleges without ever reporting to him for any test as to their qualifications in English, because of the fact that they are permitted to enter some class higher than Freshman, and he stated that in future he should protest the graduation of such students.

After some discussion Prof. Miller seconded by Prof. Neville, moved the following: "that all students who apply for entrance to classes higher than Freshman, must satisfy heads of various departments interested, that they are qualified for such higher classification."

Dr. Pryor seconded by Prof. Anderson moved as a substitute that the matter be referred to the com. on accredited schools, to report at the next meeting of the faculty.

The substitute was carried.

President Patterson referred at some length to the recent disturbances among our students on Halloween night, and expressed his judgment that the faculty should take some action in this matter looking to the punishment of the offenders, and the prevention of the recurrence of such disturbances.

Upon motion of Dr. Pryor seconded by Prof. Norwood it was ordered "that the matter of the disturbances caused by members of the student body of the college on Wednesday night be referred to the Board of Discipline, with instructions to cooperate with the grand jury in their investigations, obtain what information they can from them, and bring the offenders
