

As M College of Kentucky, Nov. 11-1904.

The faculty met in the president's office, those present being Pro. Patterson, Messrs White, W. K. Patterson, Kastle, Winford White, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Peave, Mackenzie, Fay and Burt.

The minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved.

Proposed Coll. Paper. The Colonel

A communication from R. H. Reese and others relative to a proposed college paper to be called "The Colonel" was read, in which permission was asked for the establishment of said paper as the recognized organ of the student body.

On motion it was ordered that a committee be appointed to consider this application and to act. The President appointed Profs. J. G. White, Mackenzie and Mathews.

Chairmanship of Athletic Com. resignation of Lieut Burt.

Lieut. Burt offered to the faculty his resignation as chairman of the Athletic Committee, because of his lack of acquaintance with the committees of rival institutions and of the general conditions surrounding Athletics among the colleges of this and neighboring states.

Prof. Kastle seconded by Prof. James White, while regretting Lieut Burt's action, moved its acceptance; this motion being afterward withdrawn in favor of the substitute following:-

Prof. Mackenzie moved as an expression of his high appreciation of Lieut. Burt's fitness for the chairmanship of this committee, that his resignation be respectfully declined. Carried.

College bulletins

The attention of the faculty being called to the lapse in the issuance of the regular college bulletins Prof. Anderson seconded by Prof. Kastle moved that a committee be appointed to attend to their publication. The President appointed Messrs Anderson, Mackenzie & White.

Pro. Patterson read a resolution from the Executive Com. which called upon the faculty to investigate certain damages to college property upon Halloween night, and appointed Monday Nov. 14 - 6 P. M. as time of meeting.
