

At a called meeting of the Executive Committee of State University held in the President's office, October 15th, 1915, there were present, messrs. C.B. Nicholas, R. C. Stoll, W.G. Brock, T.L. Edelen, P.P. Johnston and C.B. Terrell. On motion the committee appointed at the last meeting of the Board to go to Washington to take up the question concerning the Smith-Lever bill is hereby discharged.

Dr. Kastle come before the Committee and explained projects suggested by Dr. Knapp on the line of work under the Smith-Lever bill. On motion made, seconded and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that a committee composed of President H.S. Barker, Dr. Joseph H. Kastle and Mr. P.P. Johnston is hereby appointed to go to Washington to confer with the States Relations Committee of the United States Bureau of Agriculture to discuss and settle, definitely, all the differences between the Dean of the College of Agriculture and Dr. Bradford Knapp as to the Extention Work in Kentucky.

On motion, the meeting adjourned.
