Session 1876-77.

The faculty for the ensuing session consists of Pres. Patterson, Prof. Peter, Shackelford, Grandall, Beloit, Whittier and White.

Pres. Patterson, Prof. Shackelford, Whittier and White met in Pres. Patterson's room in College building at 10 o'clock A.M. to consult about what amount of military discipline and instruction should be expected from Col. Whittier during the session following. The board of curators at its meeting in June last having decided to make the military school optional (like other schools, English, Mathematics &c) with the students, it was decided that we would dispense with such military discipline as is <sup>not</sup> absolutely necessary to the ordinary discipline of a large number of young men and boys living together. Col. Whittier consented to make a daily inspection of club grounds to preserve cleanliness.
