The Faculty met in regular session at 8:30 a.m. Upon roll-call Dr. Bennett was found absent.

Minutes of several previous meetings were read, and, with some corrections, approved.

The President read the schedule of games proposed to be played by the Sty. S.C. Foot-ball team during the season. After

The Faculty met at 2:30 p.m., pursuant to adjournment of the morning of this date.

Bill of Spalding Bros.  
The Committee appointed to confer with the Athletic Association regarding the bill that the officers of the Athletic Association had declared their intention of discharging the debt as soon as they were able, and that a remittance of \$25.00 had already been sent to the firm. The report was accepted and the Committee discharged.

Candidates for Post-graduate Degrees.  
Dr. Kastle proposed the name of Mr. Paul Merrill for the post graduate degree of Master of Science (M.S.), with Chemistry as a major study, and German and Mathematics as minors. The Faculty concurred.

Prof. White placed the names of Misses Diddleke, Reynolds, and King, and Prof. Mummy, before the faculty as candidates for post graduate degrees. Each name was taken up separately, and work was assigned as follows:-

Prof. Mummy, - M. S. - Major, Physics;  
minor, Mathematics.

Miss Diddleke, - M. S. - Major, Biology;  
minor, German.

Miss Reynolds, - M. S. - Major, Geology;  
minor, German.

Miss King, - M. A. - Major, French;  
minors, German and Latin.

Case of Mr. Bush.  
Prof. Anderson brought before the Faculty the case of Mr. Bush, who had been guilty of boisterous and unbecomingly conduct in the Mechanical Laboratory, and who had, on that account,

been denied the privileges of the Laboratory, pending the action of the Faculty. Under the regulations, the matter was referred to the Board of Discipline.

The matter of the football games, laid over from the morning session, was taken up again, and on motion of Prof. Nelson, Mr. Kernick, Pres. of the Athletic Association, was cited before the Faculty. Mr. Kernick stated on behalf of the foot-ball team, that no contract had been made with any other team; and that none but freshmen, or higher, would be permitted to play. Mr. Kernick answered other questions, as asked by the Faculty. On motion of Dr. Kastle the foot-ball team was granted leave to play the team of Purdue (Ind.) University, at Lafayette, Ind., on Oct. 12, '95. Prof. Anderson moved to grant the team leave to play the team of DePauw (Ind.) University, at Greencastle, Indiana, Oct. 14, '95. Ayes and nays were called for and the vote stood as follows:-
