

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
November 21, 1932

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall Monday, November 21, with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of October 10 were read and approved.

Mr. Peak read a report on the Campus Book Store which was ordered included in the minutes, as follows:

"Campus Book Store Report
Senate, November, 1932

In the report of the Campus Book Store to the Senate made last year the following points were discussed.

1. History of the store.
2. Unsatisfactory results under old plan.
3. The new plan and management and prospect of better results.
4. Finances and financial outlook.

The status of finances, so far as the University is concerned, at the end of the second year under the new management will be approximately as follows:

(Book Store Report cont.)

These figures show an inventory of \$35,698.65 in stock and \$3,132.05 in fixtures. The actual cash value of the fixtures is probably \$1,000.00. This means a loss of \$2,132.05. The loss on old stock has not yet been absorbed and this will be at least \$3,698.65, making the total loss yet to be absorbed in reduction of inventory, \$5,830.70. If these losses do not exceed the \$5,830.70 then the actual value of the inventory now equals the amount of the investment, exclusive of flood loss. The figures do not include interest on investment and rental charges, no part of which we have been able to pay.

5. Plea for cooperation

The Book Store Committee has asked Mr. Morris to make a statement dealing with problems that may be largely solved by the cooperation of the University staff."

The Committee on Duplication of Work presented the following new courses and changes in courses which were approved:

College of Arts and Sciences

New courses:

Physical Education 201. Research in Physical Education.
Five hours per week. Five credits.

Changes in Courses

Change in number or title or content, or amount of credit:

English 152. Age of Pope. Omit Dryden and Pepys. The new description of the course will be: Addison and Steele, Swift, Pope and Defoe. (To replace English 152a, Restoration to Sheridan.)
Three credits.

English 147. Age of Johnson. To replace English 152b, Restoration to Sheridan. No change in content. Three credits.

English 104. The Seventeenth Century. Three credits. (To replace English 104, Milton, two credits.) Instead of giving the whole semester to Milton, the course will include lesser Seventeenth Century prose and poetry. The new description will be, Cavalier and Puritan Poetry: Milton; Burton, Browne, Bunyan, Walton; Restoration Prose and Poetry. About eight weeks will be given to Milton.

Psychology 150. European Methods in Genetic Psychology. Three credits.
Three credits.

Psychology 155. European Methods in Adult Psychology., Three credits.
(These courses are to be given by members of the faculty of the University of Vienna, under the supervision of Doctor Beaumont. They will be offered during the summer term at the Psychological Institute of the University of Vienna.)

College of Education

Education 6. Introduction to Practice Teaching. One hour per day in a grade room spent in directed classroom observation and preliminary teaching. One hour per week in conference with the training teacher. This course is designed to give the student a close contact with children and the technique of teaching and classroom management. Students will work in at least two grades of the elementary school. 3 credits.

College of Agriculture

Change in Credit

Home Economics 107a-b. Experimental Cookery. 5 credits each semester, changed to Home Economics 119a-b, 3 credits each semester.

College of Law

Law 172. Problems of Research. Two hours. (This course is reserved for honor students who are preparing to make an independent study of some legal problem under the supervision of some member of the Law School staff.)

The following recommendation of the Committee on Rules was approved:

"To be eligible for a degree at any commencement, the student must file with the Registrar an application for such degree at least four weeks prior to the commencement date."

Dean Melcher presented the social calendar for 1932-33 with a recommendation that it be approved with the exception of the date for the Pan-Hellenic Dance, Dec. 16 which is to be left open for further consideration. The Senate approved the recommendation and ordered the calendar included in the minutes, as follows:
