Dr. Pryor moved that a committee of three be appointed to prepare suitable resolutions of respect to Gen. Buell and that Pres. Patterson be Chairman of the Committee.

Dr. Pryor and Prof. Shackelford were appointed as members of the Committee, Profs. White and Neville were then made members of the Committee.

In reference to charges against cadets  
 E. J. Denton and E. O. Eakin, Major Jones  
 stated that Messrs Denton and Eakin had  
 taken a pistol, belonging to L. Anderson,  
 from his trunk on Saturday Nov 12,  
 that Mr. Denton had left the pistol at a  
 saloon on Megowan Street, that Mr  
 Anderson had found the pistol there on  
 Wednesday, Nov 16<sup>th</sup>, that the accused admitted that they had  
 taken the pistol from the trunk, but insisted that it was done as a joke.  
 After some discussion and several motions  
 without action it was voted on motion  
 of Prof. White seconded by Prof. Wernicke  
 that <sup>whereas</sup> Mr. E. J. Denton entered the trunk  
 of Mr. L. Anderson, his room mate, and  
 took therefrom Anderson's pistol without his  
 consent, and did deposit said pistol  
 with a saloon keeper on Megowan Street,  
 a street chiefly occupied by lewd women  
 and as such conduct is detrimental to the  
 interests of this college, therefore it  
 Resolved that Mr. Denton's parents be  
 requested to withdraw him from college.

On motion of Prof. Patterson ordered that  
 Mr. Eakin be placed in arrest for thirty  
 days for the part which he took in  
 removing the pistol from the trunk.
