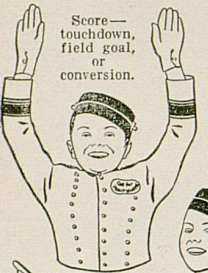
Offside or violation of kick-off formation. (Penalty, 5 yards.)

PENALTIES

1. Taking more than four times out during either half.
2. Illegal delay of game.
3. Failure of substitute to report to an official.
4. Violation of kickoff formation.
12. Team not ready to play at scheduled time.
13. Violation of rules during intermission.
14. Illegal return of suspended or disqualified player.
15. Failure to stop at least one second on shift play.
24. Striking, kneeling, or kicking opponent — half the distance to the goal and disqualification of offending player.
25. Foul within one yard line — half the distance to the goal.
26. Interference by defensive team on forward pass—first down for passing team at spot of foul.

LOSS OF FIVE YARDS

5. Illegal return or withdrawal of eligible players.
6. Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team before ball is snapped. Also, backfield man illegally in motion.

LOSS OF FIFTEEN YARDS

16. Intentional grounding of forward pass.
17. Interference by member of passing team with defensive player on an interception. (Also loss of a down.)
18. Illegal use of hands and arms by offensive player.

OTHER PENALTIES

27. Illegal forward pass — five yards from spot of pass, also loss of down.
28. Flagrant roughing of kicker —disqualification, plus fifteen yards.
29. Flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct — disqualification, plus fifteen yards.

7. Offside by either team, or encroachment on neutral zone.
8. Attempt to draw opponents off-side.
9. Flying block or flying tackle.
10. Illegal use of hands and arms by defensive player.
11. Crawling by runner.
19. Defensive player striking opponent above shoulders.
20. Roughing the kicker.
21. Piling up, hurdling, clipping.
22. Tackling player out of bounds.
23. Coaching from the sidelines.
30. Forward pass becoming incomplete beyond the line of scrimmage by touching or being touched by an ineligible player—loss of fifteen yards from spot of preceding down, play to count as down.
31. Illegal touching of kicked ball inside opponent's 10 yard line—touchback.

COACH CHARLES W. BACHMAN

Michigan State College

A bold grid theorist whose deanship in football spans a coaching period of 26 years, Head Coach Charles W. Bachman begins his 14th season at Michigan State where he holds a tenure record of .692 per cent in gridiron triumphs. His Spartans have won 65 games while losing 29 and tying 10 of 104 games played.

This is Bachman's second period of post-war coaching. The leather-skinned ex-Notre Damer, labeled "Boy Wonder of the Western Conference when he coached Northwestern in 1919 at the age of 25, has been, down through the years, the amateur athlete's most avid champion.

His contributions and criticisms of football stem on logic developed from his early days at Chicago Englwood High, where he won football and track laurels, through Notre Dame where he won a trio of monograms in each sport, as a regular on the 1917 Great Lakes' National Championship football team and thence into the realm of actual coaching.

Two years ago, "Bach" instituted at Michigan State the "Flying Z" offense which he developed while coaching on lend-lease at Camp Grant in 1943. Michigan State was without football that year because of the war. The offense runs off the balanced line on theory that every play should hit or threaten the middle of the line before disclosing its final course. It marks Bachman's most recent contribution to the game of which he has been a devoted student and coach.

"Bach's" coaching career got a quick start as an assistant at DePauw University in 1917. He previously became a "name" at Notre Dame when selected guard in 1914 and 1916 on the All Western or mythical "dream" team of the country. He played fullback for the Fighting Irish in 1916.

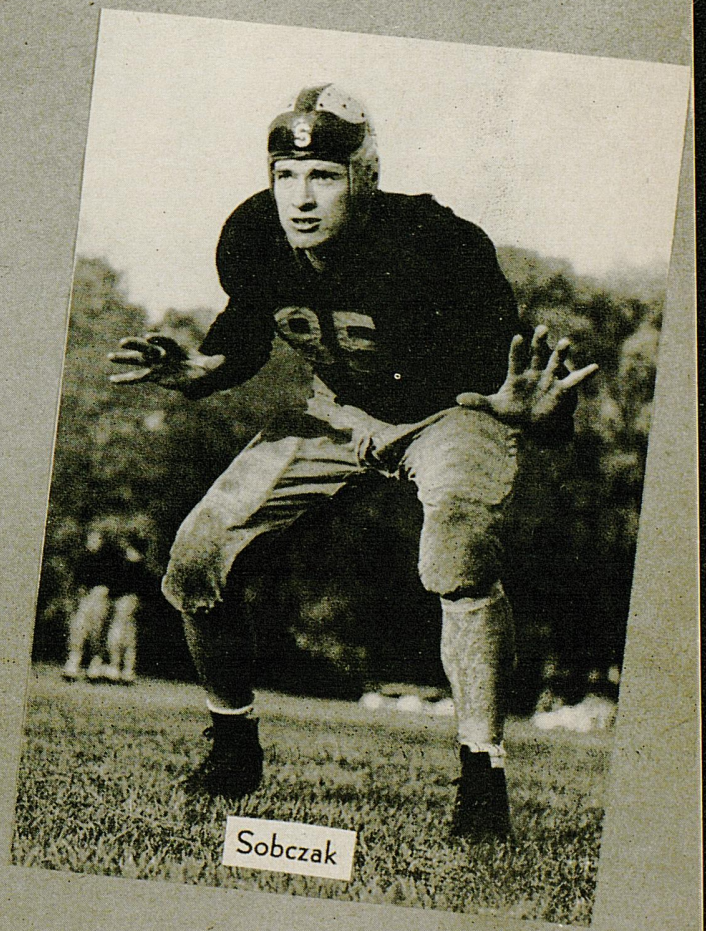
Indeed, "Bach" was also a competent all around trackman in early days. He came to within two points of single-handedly winning the Illinois State prep track title in 1911, and later at Notre Dame won the world's discus record in the Penn Relays. Two hours later, his record was eclipsed at another meet by his old friend, Arlie Mucks, of Wisconsin.

Born December 2, 1893, in Chicago, "Bach's" family includes his wife, Grace; three sons, Charles, Jr., 21, recently discharged from two years of service in the southwest Pacific war theatre; J. Cary, 17, a standout athlete at East Lansing High; and John L., 14.

"SPARTAN"—How It Came To Be

The practicality of a pair of Lansing sports writers who imposed the "silent treatment" on a contest-winning nickname, and then followed with a substitute of their own, led to the adoption of "Spartans" as the sobriquet for Michigan State College.

It was in 1926 that Michigan Agricultural College became Michigan State College. The institution followed with a contest and selected "The Michigan Staters" to supplant "Aggies" as the school's nickname.

George S. Alderton, sports editor of the Lansing State Journal, and Dale Stafford, managing editor of the Detroit Free Press, then working on the Lansing Capital News, decided the contest-winning name was too cumbersome and vowed to find a better one.

The pair found the name "Spartans" among those rejected by the contest committee. It had been submitted by Perry J. Fremont, a former M.S.C. athlete.

It was in connection with Michigan State's

southern Baseball trip in 1926 at Fort Benning, Ga., that the nickname "Spartans" was first used. Rewriting game leads, Mr. Alderton first used the word sparingly and then ventured into headlines with it. (He chides himself for having incorrectly spelled the new name with an "o," as "Sparton," the first two days, changing it the third day to "Spartan" on instruction of a friend).

As Mr. Alderton explains: "No student alumnus or official had called up the editor to complain about our audacity in giving the old school a new name, so we ventured into headlines with it. . . Happily for the experiment, the name took. It began appearing in other newspapers and when the student publications used it, that clinched it.

Inception of the new name, "Spartan," did not occur without exacting a toll.

"We paced the floor when he was born at Fort Benning, Ga.," admits Mr. Alderton.
