In order to accept the positions, it will be necessary for them to gettheir examinations a few days early. She therefore, requested the permission of the Faculty to give special examinations to these girls. On motion of Dr. Terrill, seconded by Prof. Miller, it was voted to grant the special examinations and the schedule of examinations to be arranged by the Schedule Committee.

Prof. Miller asked special permission to introduce a motion in reference to granting honorary degrees, which was granted.
