Lexington, May 6/95.

An adjourned meeting of the Faculty was held on above date at 3 p.m.

The subject of Class marching was again taken up by the offering of a substitute by Bro. W. K. Patterson for his resolution of May 3 (See p. 94). This substitute follows:-

"(1) Whereas, the Regulations of the College relating to Class marching and class matters were entirely suspended from Sept. 1890 to Jan. 1894; and

(2) Whereas, their nominal enforcement from the latter date to the present time has been the cause of great disorder and confusion, and much loss of time; and

(3) Whereas, their enforcement in letter and spirit would not materially strengthen or promote the efficiency of the Military Department of the College; - therefore Resolved, that the Faculty recommend to the Board of Trustees that they repeal those sections of the Regulations which relate to Class marching and class marches, and that they cause a bell to be placed in the tower of the main building to be rung by the janitor at the beginning of the duties of the day, and at the close of each recitation hour."

Dr. Kastle moved a division of the resolution, - carried. Prof. Road moved to take the vote on the preamble section by section, - carried. The preamble and the resolution referring to class marching were carried. Dr. Kastle moved to strike out the part of the resolution referring to the bell, - carried.
