It appeared upon the records of the Board of Discipline that Cadet Jones had been required to squad-drill when he had accumulated 25 demerits.

whereupon Prof. Wernicke offered the following:
In as much as Mr. Jones was required to do squad-drill by the Board of Discipline for accumulating 25 demerits and in as much as this punishment may be construed by the accused and others as a penalty, cancelling the said demerits, although the faculty do not so consider it.

Resolved that Mr. Jones is entitled to the

benefit of the probable interpretation which he and others may place upon said action and that it is expedient that he be given the benefit of said construction,
