



GSA celebrates Eleventh Anniversary

The GLSO Gay Straight Alliance for Youth has now been active for eleven years! We started to have meetings in a half-completed Pride Center in February, 2001. We had 3 youths at two meetings in February. Then our first meeting in March attracted 13 high school teens plus an older sister who wanted to be sure her brother would be OK. (He now works for an auction house in Chicago... doing better than OK.)

We met in what is now the computer room and, boy, it was crowded! The energy was electric. There was sawing and hammering in the larger room but that did not drown out the excited conversation. Those young people--and others who have spent time with us--are now collegiate leaders, activists, dancers, authors, teachers, mothers, actors, and work in a wide variety of diversified fields. Among our graduates, we also have an opera singer, an Eagle Scout, a nurse, a chef, and a writer who was nominated for a Lambda Literary Award while still in college.

A "first" for this year: a young man who is a junior, and head of his school GSA, ordered a high school ring with the initials "GSA" on it. This is just one example of how many of our youth have worked for, and achieved a change in, the atmosphere in local high schools. They have also helped us produce a variety of social dances, and are now gearing up for our sixth Pride Prom.

Straight teens share a part in the GSAs, too. Sometimes they are there because they also experience themselves as different, in some way, from the dominant culture; some have a gay person in their family; others just enjoy

hanging out with us. We sometimes refer to our youth as our "Queerlings", a word invented by Trilby Trent, a long-term GSA adviser.

It has been great to work with teens during these years. I think that teenagers are on the cutting edge of many changes in our culture. They are risk takers; willing to tell the truth, as they know it, about who they are. They are knowledgeable, sharing with us information to help fellow teens who are struggling with unsupportive families or with suicidal feelings.

They are also activists; setting up information booths at their schools, celebrating "Ally Week", "Day of Silence", "No Name Calling Week", and working to stop bullying. One school GSA published a magazine with articles about GLBTQ issues. Some youth take a stand simply by being flamboyantly themselves.

We have had many individuals help us in previous years and hope that we have the biggest turnout and response ever for volunteers for the day of and the duties leading up to the Festival. What Does It Mean to Be A Christian?

Recently I took a simple survey asking friends, co-workers, and my Facebook friends what they thought it meant to be a Christian. I received a variety of answers but none that surprised me. My church friends answered the way I would have expected with it's being Christ like. Others, who classify themselves as Christians, gave answers like being a good person, not hurting people, being truthful, not stealing, back stabbing, that sort of thing. Then a few who do not see themselves as a Christian gave a little more vague answer like who's to say with so many different religions. As a minister of the gospel, I look to the Bible for my definition of a Christian.

Even though the doesn't come right out with a definition it does give us a description. Jesus told his disciples to come follow me. By that Jesus was not referring to just drop what you are doing and walk with Me, but learn from Me, do what I do. One of Christ's characteristics is forgiveness. The first thing I think of is the story of the woman who was caught in adultery and was about to be stoned to death by the crowds of people. When confronted about the situation Jesus simply states that the person without sin can throw the first stone. No one did, they all walked away. Jesus looks at the woman and says basically that no one is accusing you, now go and sin no more. Jesus knew she was guilty but wasn't there to put blame or guilt, just to say yes you missed it by committing adultery but stop committing the sin and carry on with life. The definition of sin is missing the mark and we all do that. The mark of course is being like Christ. Ephesians 1:7 "We have redemption in Him through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace" Redemption in Him is having been bought with the price of the blood of Christ on the cross which results in total forgiveness. Then we are told to go and forgive as we have been forgiven.

The GLSO is interested in starting a Senior Social Group that will meet Saturday, March 17th at 7PM at the Pride Center.



NOH8 Campaign Open Photo Shoot in Lexington!!!

On Tuesday, March 20th the NOH8 Campaign will set up their mobile studio at the Hilton Lexington/Downtown Hotel in Lexington! The photo shoot is scheduled to begin at 5:00PM and end at 8:00PM. In coordination with Lexington Fairness, this will be the NOH8 Campaign's first photo shoot in Kentucky!

You do not need to make reservations; it's first come, first served - and they move quickly! When you arrive, you will receive a numbered model release to fill out, followed by receiving your NOH8 tattoo. Numbers will be called throughout the day, and your corresponding release number will signal your time to line up to have your photo taken.

The costs of posing for an official NOH8 portrait break down as follows:

SOLO PORTRAITS are \$40.00 COUPLE & GROUP PORTRAITS are \$25.00 per person

The NOH8 Campaign accepts cash, most major credit cards, and checks made out to 'NOH8Campaign'. Fees cover services & processing for one retouched digital print only (made available through www.NOH8Campaign.com) and do not include physical prints.

The lines moves quickly, so don't let the RSVP's intimidate you! The Campaign always does their best to make sure that everyone in line by 8:00PM has a chance to pose for their photo - and up to this point, they haven't ever had to turn anyone away! Anyone that would like to join the NOH8 Campaign is asked to wear a plain white shirt to match the look of

the signature NOH8 photos.

Celebrity Photographer & NOH8 Co-Founder Adam Bouska will be working around the clock to photograph 5-10 frames for each person that comes through. The final selection he chooses will be retouched and made available to you in about 8 weeks through the website: www.NOH8Campaign.com

Make sure to arrive between 5:00PM and 8:00PM at the Hilton Lexington/Downtown Hotel (369 West Vine Street, Lexington, KY 40507). Come camera ready, wear white, and pose and make a statement!

Once you arrive, the NOH8 Campaign will apply the NOH8 temporary tattoo to your face, and they will also supply you with the silver duct tape for the photo.

Funds raised by the NOH8 Campaign will be used to continue promoting and raising awareness for marriage equality and antidiscrimination through NOH8's interactive media campaign. Under consideration is the expansion of the campaign to other media, including television and radio broadcast, billboards, and magazines. The Blood Donation Controversy: Is it okay to lie?

I hope everyone is enjoying the new column by Cousin Query. I know you're reading it, because I've heard from a number of readers that they were appalled that Cousin Query said he has lied in order to donate blood.

It's certainly a sensitive topic, situated at the crossroads between legality and morality. In Canada, it is illegal to lie in order to donate blood, but that's not the case here in Kentucky. Nevertheless, some people still believe that it is immoral.

My own personal view is that the ban on gay men donating blood is immoral, and that in order to provide lifesaving blood, it is acceptable to lie when asked the question, "Have you had sex with a man since 1977?" But there's a caveat: you should be sure of your status first.

You might wonder why I'm so convinced that the ban on gay men donating blood is rooted in homophobia, rather than good science. Consider these statistics: in 2005, men who have sex with men accounted for 49 percent of new HIV cases. These men are permanently deferred as blood donors if they answer the questions honestly.

By contrast, in 2007, African Americans accounted for 49 percent of new HIV cases. It would be utterly unthinkable to

tell African Americans that they are permanently deferred from donating blood simply because of the color of their skin. The statistics make clear that it isn't the risk of HIV which drives the ban, but rather a climate that makes it okay to discriminate based on sexual orientation. The counterpoint is that while blood testing procedures have improved drastically since this rule was first enacted during the AIDS scare of the mid-1980s, there is still a risk that some HIV-infected blood will make it past the testing procedures. While this is true, and there is a very real need to prescreen blood by turning away high-risk donors, current policy is throwing out the baby with the bath water. A better policy would involve tailoring the screening questions towards high-risk behaviors, than excluding an entire group of people regardless of how safe an individual member is. Until the screeners begin asking specific questions about high risk behaviors like IV drug use and unprotected sex, many of us are stuck with the conundrum of how to answer that pesky little question about whether we've had sex with a man since 1977. Whether to lie in order to donate blood is a question that each person must answer for himself, but I recommend a middle ground of personal responsibility. In Central Kentucky, organizations like AVOL make it easy to know your status. If you practice safe sex and get regular HIV tests to know your status, I see no problem with telling a white lie to save lives.

Matty Dean arrives in New York City, become friends with La Meranda and other local drag queens, and is caught up in a raid at the Stonewall Inn.

He meets and works with gay activists who favor peaceful protest.

Matty helps La Meranda deal with the draft board, visits Fire Island, and learns about the mafia's controlling interest in gay bars.

This is an enjoyable film that also teaches some gay history.







