Upon motion of Prof. J. G. White Dr. Sheekleford was requested to prepare a memorial for publication. The Com. on Resolutions now reported, and recommended that the memorial notice be published in connection with the resolutions. The report and recommendation were adopted. The Faculty convened in called meeting to hear the report of the Dormitory Committee upon the matter of order upon the grounds and the protection of property, referred to them at the last meeting.

First, however, at the suggestion of the President, action was taken upon the death of the mother of Dr. Shackelford, which occurred Nov. 7.

Prof. W.H. Patterson moved the appointment of a Com. on Resolutions to consist of Prof. Neville, Prof. White, and Prof. Helveti. Carried. [see file B, No. 3]

Upon motion of R.M. Roark it was resolved to dismiss school for the day. Upon motion of Dr. Kastle it was resolved that the Faculty should attend, in a body, upon the funeral services at the house of Dr. Shackelford.

Cal. Clay read the report of the Dormitory Committee, to the effect that there should be some person - preferably Prof. V.E. Murrey - regularly employed to look after the order and government of the Dormitories, and that a night-watchman should be employed to look after the property of the State and the Federal Govt. on the College grounds.
