The University Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, January 12, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of December 15 were read and approved.

 Animal Industry 209a and 209b, Seminar, 1 credit each semester".

Virgil E. Burns was recommended to the Board of Trustees for the degree of bachelor of arts in education to be counted with the class of 1924.
