The faculty met at 3.30 P. M. at the call of the President, in his office.

Reception of

Pres. Patterson announced the expected visit of the Kentucky Assembly to the college on Tuesday Feb. 11 - and suggested that the details of their entertainment while at the college should be arranged.

After a brief discussion it was agreed that the Cadet Corps should escort the members of the legislature from their train to the Phoenix Hotel and that all students should assemble in Chapel at 10.45. It was further provided that after the chapel exercises were closed, the visitors should be divided into five groups, each in charge of a member of the faculty, for the inspection of the various departments of the college.

Feb. 10 - continued -

President Patterson announced that he had been waited upon by several visitors from the University of Tennessee at Knoxville with reference to the institution of a new fraternity in this college; that he had acquainted them with the regulations relating to such institution, and suggested that a com. of the faculty might be appointed, in anticipation of any communication relative thereto that might be received from ^{members of} the student body, to consider such a communication.

Upon motion of Prof. Miller, seconded by Prof. Brooks it was ordered that a committee of three be appointed for this purpose, with power to act. The Chair appointed Profs. Miller, Brooks, and Roark.

The faculty met in called session in the President's room at 3.30 P.M. those present being Prof. the President, Profs. White, Roark, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Peace, Brooks, Mackenzie, and Maj. W. K. Keen.

A report of the Board of Discipline was read, referring to the faculty without recommendation the cases of W. W. Harn, R. A. Campbell and P. P. Sealey, charged with firing explosives in and around the dormitory, and with other conduct prejudicial to good order and discipline in the College.

Mr. Harn having left the college, Messrs Campbell and Sealey were summoned before the faculty.

Prof. Mackenzie as a member of the board of discipline detailed the main facts of the case as they had been brought out in the meetings of the board.

Capt. Berry as a witness stated the facts which led him to believe that the explosions in several cases at least had originated in the room occupied by Messrs Harn & Campbell.

Mr. Campbell denied having caused any of the explosions, but said that Mr. Harn had admitted causing some of them.
