The faculty met at 3³⁰ P.M. at the call of the president, anticipating by two days the date of the regular meeting. Those present were president Patterson, professors James White, Neville, Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pease, Mackenzie, Norwood, M. White, Wilson, Tuttle, Gumbrod, Rowe, Frankel.

The minutes of the last two meetings were read and approved.

Report on
revision of
Course in Acad.
emy.

The committee on revision of the course in the academy reported through Prof. Patterson, outlining a three year course. After some discussion it was moved by Prof. Miller, seconded by C. W. Mathews, that the report be received and adopted. Prof. Wilson, seconded by Prof. Norwood, ^{as a substitute} moved that action upon the question be deferred until the next meeting of the faculty. Upon an aye and no vote the substitute was lost by a vote of 12 to 4.

Upon an aye and no vote upon the original question it was carried with only one negative vote.

Upon motion of Prof. Miller, seconded by Dr. Pryor, it was ordered that a committee be appointed to consider the further question of entrance requirements for the various college courses. Pres. Patterson named upon this committee the dean of course of study, with the addition of Prof. Miller.

Pres. Patterson made a statement to the faculty concerning the efforts that were being made by various individuals to secure the reinstatement of Messrs. Shuff and Wilhoite who were dismissed by action of the faculty at the meeting of March 12, for cheating on examinations.

Prof Anderson, seconded by Prof. Norwood moved that, ~~in view of the expressed wishes~~ of Mr. Dyer, we consider the reinstatement of Messrs. Shuff and Wilkoi.

Prof. Wilson seconded by Prof. Anderson moved as an amendment that all the students who were dismissed on Mar. 12, be included in this reconsideration.

After a somewhat extended discussion, Prof. Neville, seconded by Prof. Miller, moved that all of these men, with the addition of Mr. Chapman, who had been suspended earlier in the year for a similar offense, be restored to their ^{college} privileges and ^{in accordance with the proposals offered by two of them} duties upon Apr 15, provided, that they will make a full and free confession of cheating upon examination, before the assembled students in chapel, and that they will give appropriate assurances of correct future conduct.

This motion was carried upon an aye and no vote recorded as follows.
