The faculty met in the President's room  
at 3 pm

Present: Pres. Patterson, Profs. Kastle, Mathews, Miller  
W.K. Patterson, Bruce, Puyor, Werwick,

The minutes of the previous meeting  
were read for information.

The proposed schedule for the Scientific Course,  
a copy of which is attached hereto, was  
discussed and recommended to the Board  
of Trustees for adoption.

Prof. Werwick submitted the following as  
a report of a special committee.

1 That no student shall be considered as  
belonging to a ~~given~~ class, unless he  
takes at least three studies selected in  
that class or higher.

Example: No student is a sophomore unless  
he takes 3 studies classed in the sophomore or  
junior year.

2 No student shall pass into a higher class  
while he has to make up studies required, in  
his case, in the preceding year.

Example a sophomore will remain a sophomore  
as long as he has failed to complete his freshman  
studies.

3 Students may be permitted, by the deans  
of their courses and the Professors with  
whom they take their major studies, to register  
for studies not more than one year in  
advance of their classification.

Example: A sophomore may register for junior  
but not for senior studies.

4 as there will be a discrepancy in  
the future between the division of time in  
the College and Academy respectively, the  
grades which any Academy students may  
make in freshman studies shall only be  
recorded on the books of the College proper  
and counted with the other freshman grades  
of the student (which he may make during  
the following year).

On motion the foregoing resolutions were  
approved and recommended to the Board  
of Trustees for adoption.
