President Dickey reported to the Faculty that in 1941 the Board of Trustees, recognizing the problems resulting from so many men being called into service, made a change in and liberalized the refund policy governing fees. He stated that at the end of the second World War when the University changed from the semester to the quarter system, and again when it returned to the semester plan, the Registrar's Office modified the refund policies without Faculty and Board approval and that from time to time since then changes had been made; that he was asking the Faculty to approve the following refund policy for recommendation to the Board of Trustees, such policy to become effective September 1, 1963:

A student who officially withdraws from the University after registration but before the middle of the term, may, upon presentation to the Registrar's Office of official withdrawal evidence, student records, and identification card, be refunded one-half of the fees paid for the term. If the withdrawal occurs after the middle of the term, no refund will be given.

The Faculty approved the recommendation as presented.

Dean Shaver presented a request from the College of Engineering to waive the two-drop rule for David E. Lockett. He stated that Mr. Lockett attended the University three semesters and a summer session beginning in the fall of 1958; that since 1960 he had been employed by North American Aviation; that from 1961 to the present he had been attending Compton College, Compton, California, and had earned a 3.5 standing on 26 of 30 completed units; and that he wished to return to the University of Kentucky to pursue his degree in Metallurgical Engineering beginning with the fall semester 1963-64. The Faculty approved the request for waiver of the two-drop rule for Mr. Lockett.

Dr. Weaver stated that he had received a letter from the Elections Committee that a vote had been taken for election of a non-voting member to the Board of Trustees. He reported that three ballots were held and that Professor Paul Oberst received the majority vote which elected him to a three-year term beginning July 1, 1963.

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Dr. Weaver, Chairman of the University Faculty Council, recommended to the Faculty approval of the Rules Committee's revision of the proposal for creation of the University Faculty Council and Committee on Curriculum which had been circulated under date of May 14, 1963, and the deletion of two sections of the Rules. The Faculty approved the revision and deletion as circulated.

1. Name and Composition -- The University Faculty Council shall be composed of nine persons elected by the University Faculty from its own membership, in the manner prescribed hereinafter.
2. Purpose and Functions -- The purpose of the Council shall be to enable the Faculty more effectively to perform its primary role in formulating and carrying out educational policy for the University, as described in the 1960 Governing Regulations of the University, pp. 8-9. The Council shall be specifically charged with continuously reviewing the University's programs and policies and providing leadership for the University Faculty in assuming its proper role in the formation and implementation of University policy and plans. In accordance herewith the Council shall serve as an executive committee for the Faculty in fulfilling the following functions:
 - a. The Council shall study and report or recommend (at the Faculty's direction or on its own initiative) to the Faculty on any matters of concern to the Faculty. Proposals made from the floor in the Faculty meetings may, by majority vote, be referred to the Council for further study and recommendation. A motion to refer an issue to the Council shall take precedence over any prior motion.
 - b. Faculty committees shall report through the Council, which will receive, consider, and recommend action on committee reports. Faculty committees may, and normally will, distribute their reports directly to all members of the Faculty, but the Council shall present them for action, with or without its own recommendations.
 - c. The Council shall advise the President and Secretary of the Faculty on agenda and program for Faculty meetings, on the appointment and discharge of Faculty committees and on personnel of such committees.
 - d. The Council shall have power to act for the Faculty on course and curriculum changes, and on other matters delegated to it by the Faculty. Action taken by the Council shall be reported in writing to the University Faculty. The Faculty shall have the power to **reverse** a Council action or to delay its effective date for further study. However, if no action is taken by the Faculty on a Council decision which has been reported in writing to the Faculty seven or more days prior to the Faculty meeting, the decision of the Council shall stand. When the Council takes an action which needs to be made effective immediately, but circumstances prevent written notification seven days before a Faculty meeting, the Council may report the action at the meeting for approval or disapproval by a majority of those present and voting.

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e. Special Duty -- It shall be the special duty of the Council to promote and implement total University objectives, in accordance with the principle of unity within the University, as stated on pp. 35-36 of the 1960 Governing Regulations of the University. The Council members shall act as representatives of the total Faculty and total University, rather than representatives of their particular colleges. The Council shall maintain close liaison with the President, the Secretary of the Faculty, and the other administrative officers of the University.

3. Selection, Terms, and Make-up of the Council -- Any elected member of the Faculty (or person appointed to replace an elected member) whose term of office has not expired at the time of election shall be eligible for election to the Council. Council members may be re-elected to successive terms. Persons eligible for the Faculty but not currently members may be made eligible for election or re-election to the Council by a nominating petition signed by 15 members of the Faculty and filed with the Secretary prior to October 1st. Once elected to the Council a person shall continue to serve on the Council for the length of his Council term, regardless of whether his term on the Faculty may expire meanwhile. While serving on the Council a person shall have the full rights and privileges of a member of the Faculty.

The election shall be conducted by the Elections Committee of the Faculty.

The terms of Council members shall be three years. In the event of resignation or death, the President shall, with the advice of the Council, appoint a successor to serve until the next Council election, at which time a person shall be elected to serve for any portion of the term that remains.

The Council shall select its officers annually, at its first meeting following the annual election of new members. Five members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of Council business.

4. Committee on Curriculum -- To assist the Council in studying curriculum and course recommendations, a new committee of the Faculty shall be appointed. This committee shall be called the Committee on Curriculum, and shall consist of one representative from each of the following fourteen teaching units of the University, as listed in the 1960 Governing Regulations of the University, page 8:

Literature, Philosophy and Arts	Law
Social Studies	Education
Physical Sciences	Commerce
Biological Sciences	Pharmacy
Agriculture	Medicine
Home Economics	Nursing
Engineering	Dentistry

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The Committee on Curriculum shall review and study all proposed course changes and make its recommendation to the Council, which may approve, disapprove, or refer the proposal back to the college with a request for further information, or with suggestions for modification. In reviewing curriculum proposals it shall be the duty of the Council and the Committee on Curriculum to strive toward the formulation and implementation of a consistent University-wide policy.

The term of office on this committee shall be three years, with four members appointed the first year, five the second, and five the third year. Members shall be eligible for reappointment and shall take office January 1 following appointment.

5. Revision of this document -- The structure and functions of the Council may be changed by majority vote of the Faculty.

Dr. Weaver asked for Faculty approval of item 2 of the circularization of May 27th from the Honors Program Committee which asked that students having fulfilled the requirements of the Honors Program Committee have it so stated on their transcripts and diplomas. The Faculty approved this request.

Dr. Weaver stated that the College of Arts and Sciences omitted English 526, 527, and 395 in the list of courses to be offered in Europe during the 1963 Summer Session when request for approval of that list was presented and approved by the University Faculty at its meeting of May 14, 1962; that the omission was discovered too late to be brought before the Arts and Sciences Faculty at its last meeting; that the Curriculum Committee had approved these three courses and the Council wished to recommend that the minutes of May 14, 1962 be amended to include English 526, 527, and 395. The Faculty approved this recommendation.

Dr. Weaver announced that immediately following the meeting a social hour with President Dickey would be held immediately across the hall in the Conference Room for the University Faculty members and that other members of the faculty would come from 4:00 to 5:00. He stated that the Faculty Council, on behalf of the University Faculty, had prepared a statement which it wished to be included in these minutes and which he was directing to President Dickey.

As the time for your departure draws near, the students and the staff of the University of Kentucky are mindful of the many ways in which they have been indebted to you for leadership during the years of your presidency. Different groups within the University community have in their various ways already expressed to you and Mrs. Dickey the particular sense of indebtedness which they feel. It is particularly fitting that the University Faculty should express its appreciation for the confidence you have always placed in that body and for the many ways in which you have encouraged and assisted it in taking an increasingly responsible role in the conduct of University affairs. For this confidence, therefore; for your cultivation of an atmosphere friendly to Faculty, cooperation between Faculty, Administration, and Trustees; for your support of the development of procedures designed to free the Faculty of routine

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duties so that it might become an effective deliberative body; for your support of its committee and conference reports and recommendations; for these and for the many other contributions which you have made to the proper functioning of this body, as well as to the University as a whole, we the members of the University Faculty extend to you our sincere appreciation and our very best wishes as you leave us to take on your new duties. It is with sincere feelings that we say "Thanks for everything" and "Godspeed" for the years ahead.

In thanking the Faculty Dr. Dickey made the following remarks:

Dr. Weaver and members of the Faculty:

I had already made up my mind that there would be no farewells and tears this afternoon, but I want to say quite frankly that of all the wonderful and generous gestures made during the past few weeks I appreciate this more for the simple reason that this has been the most exciting part of serving with you. I feel apologetic about acknowledging this statement as I think you are giving me more credit than I deserve. You deserve more credit than I because changes that have ~~been~~ taken place have come from hard work, devotion, and loyalty of the faculty. I am aware of this and cognizant of the deep debt of gratitude I owe to you for taking the responsibility and effort to bring this institution to new points of quality and greatness. I am eternally grateful (not for this statement alone) but for all that you have done. I think it has been one of the most interesting and stimulating experiences that one could have had -- to have had the privilege of working with the complex and varying parts of the University through people of ability, good will, and real devotion and loyalty. I wish for you everything that is good for you as individuals and for the University in the years to come.

Last Friday and Saturday I had four different conversations with Dr. John Oswald and during one of these times he asked what some of the meetings would be in the next few days. When I told him the University Faculty meeting he asked that I give to you his regards and his appreciation for the support he knew would be coming; that he was very sorry that he would be unable to meet this group until later. I take great pleasure in bring^{ing} you these greetings from Dr. Oswald. I also think we owe the Board of Trustees and those who had part in this selection our sincere appreciation because I believe the University of Kentucky will be in excellent hands and that he has the welfare and interest of this group. I hope you will give to him the same unfailing, fine cooperation which it has been my pleasure to enjoy during the past seven years.

The meeting adjourned at 3:35 p.m.
