

THEY CONFER

Kentucky's seventh annual educational conference will be held here today and tomorrow. One thousand teachers and instructors are well-comed. Noted speakers and educators from all parts of the country will address the assembly and many valuable programs are planned. The fact that this conference is to be opened successfully for the seventh time is, in itself, significant. Six times previously our workers in educational fields have come together for discussion of general and individual problems, and have gone away benefitted. Various meetings of the convention will be educational in more than one sense. Not only will new methods of learning be explained, but the teachers themselves will be addressed by prominent educations, where the suggestions and new ideas will aid every instructor's future work. 
