

Pomis-House April 7th, 1748.

My Lord,

As I have the most sincere Desire to serve
Mr. Palmer, I took the first opportunity to enquire
concerning the Sincure, which is fallen to my disposal
by the translation of D.^r Sisle to Norwich. I find it is
the Rectory of Corwen in Merionethshire & the reputed
value 90 £ ann^y, which is the highest I have yet met
with. But as all these Sincures are presentative, &
not donative, they require Institution; but I hope
that will be no obstacle to it's being compatible with a
Studentship of Christ-Church, since it is not attended
with a Cure of Souls. I beg Your Lordship, who has
shewn so kind a Concern for Mr. Palmer, would have
the goodness to write a line to him on this Subject, & to
desire He would acquaint us whether this Benefice will
suit his Views, & be convenient for him; for, if it will,
it will give me much pleasure to contribute to his
