can remedy an accident-

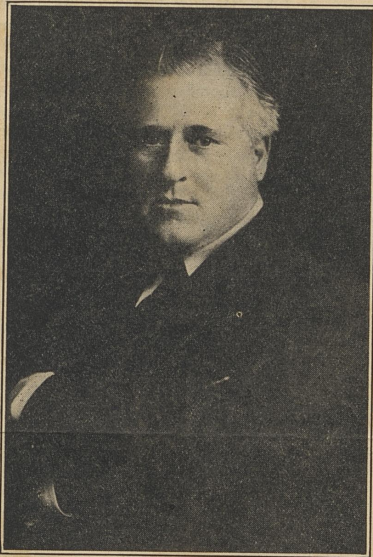
which ~~B~~ has occurred.
