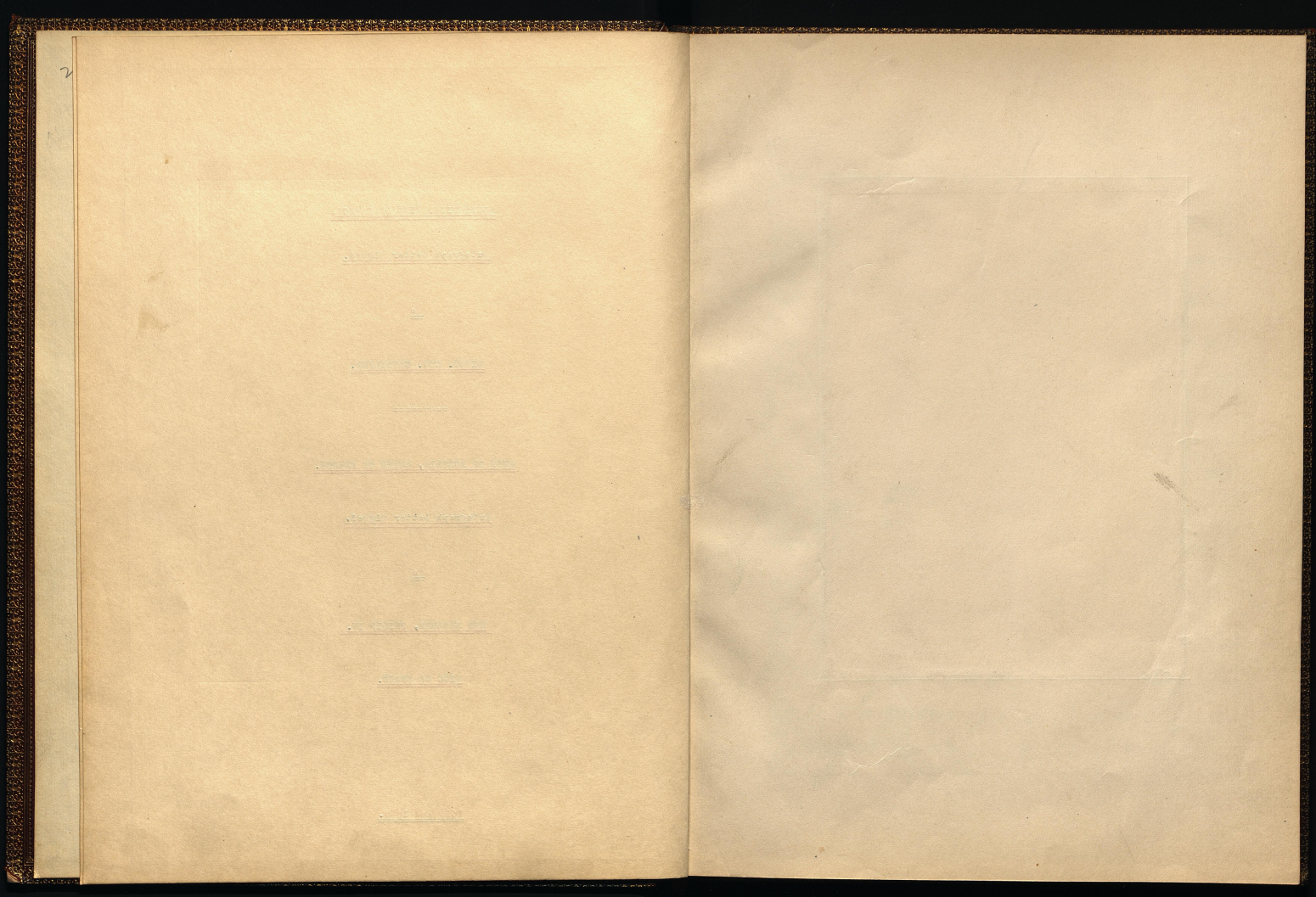

LETTER OF KING LOUIS XIII TO LIEUT. GOV. BOUILLIER.

¶ Monsieur Bouillier;

¶ I write you this word in order that you may write at once to Mr. De Bende that in case the Longjumeau Regiment has not yet entered Nancy, that he should not let it do so until he receives new orders, and that he should retain one of the old Regiments there.

¶ The reason is that no Regiment has ever plundered and looted like they have, and it is only suitable that some of the Officers should be punished for it, and that it would not be proper to put in a place so ticklish as that people who fear that they will be punished for the wrongs they have committed.

¶ I was not willing to write this to the CARDINAL (Richelieu) for fear of worrying him in the state he is, for fear that it might make him worse. All the same, you will show him this letter, if you think it proper.

¶ Send me news of Monsieur the Cardinal often, for if I am one day without hearing of him, I am extremely grieved.

(1633).

Louis XIII. King of France, succeeded to the Crown at the murder of his Father, Henry the Great, by Francis Ravallac, in May, 1610; reigned until 1643, and was succeeded by his son, by Anne of Austria, Louis XIV., when four years old. Anne and her lover, Cardinal Mazarin, ruled France until Louis XIV. became of age.

LETTER OF ANNE OF AUSTRIA, QUEEN OF FRANCE,  
TO HER BROTHER, KING PHILIP IV. OF SPAIN.

¶ My Brother:

¶ The King, my Son, dispatching to the Emperor, General de Mondevergut, one of his Counsellors and Marshal of His Camps and Armies, to offer his Condolences on the death of the Empress, my sister, I have ordered him to go by way of Munich, so that he might convey to you, in these lines, the assurance of the Continuation of my Affection, and to tell you that there is hardly anything else I more ardently desire than to have the opportunity to show you this often.

¶ I beg you to believe all that I say, and all that De Mondevergut will tell you on behalf of the King and myself on what is going on, and believe me, with all tenderness and esteem possible,

Paris, October 3, 1649.

ANNE OF AUSTRIA, eldest daughter of Philip III., King of Spain, and Queen of France, by her Marriage with Louis XIII. Mother of Louis XIV., and Regent of France during his minority. Born 1602. Died 1656.

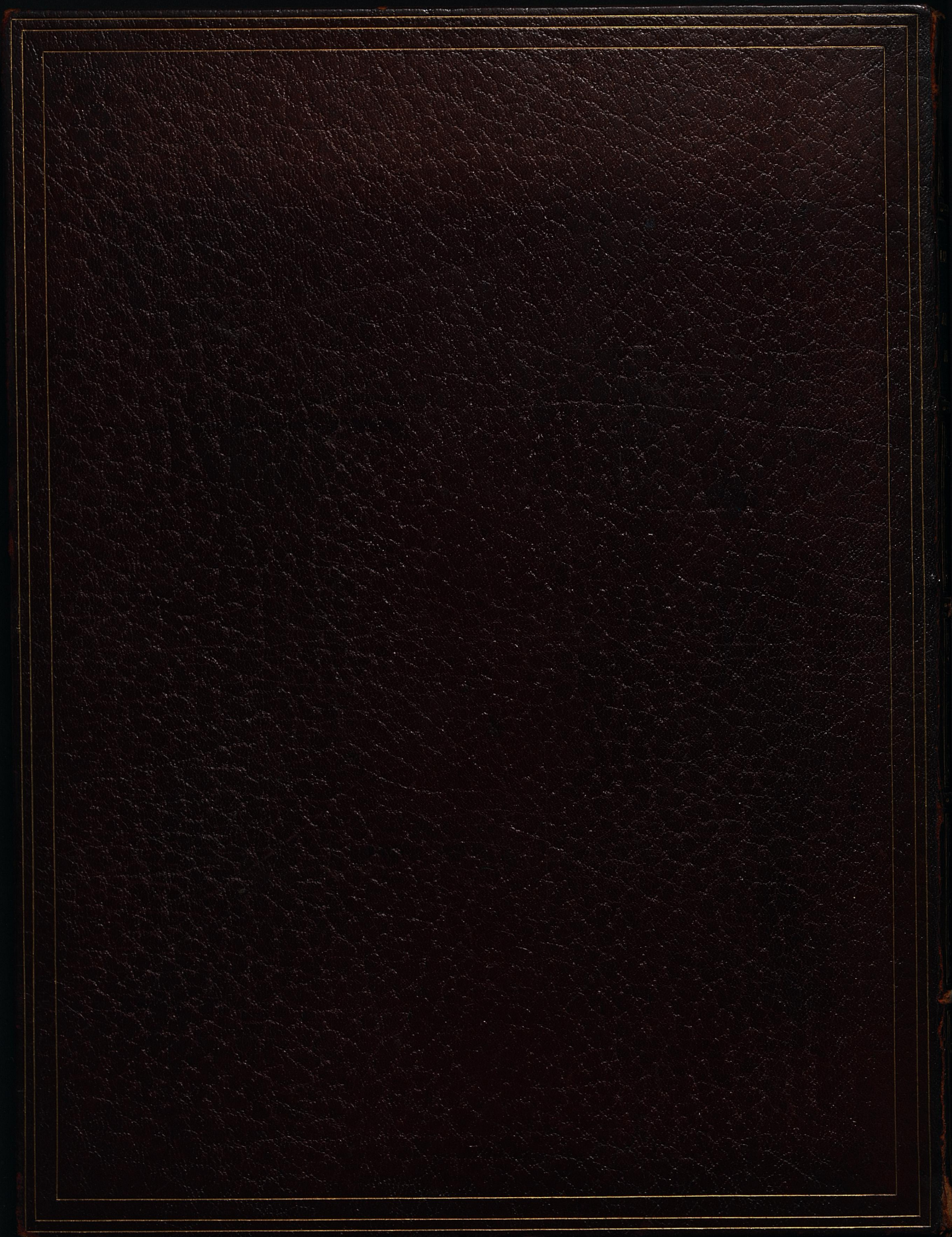
