Married princess Frederica of Prussia	29 Sept. 1791
Commanded British forces at Antwerp, 8 April, 1793; at siege of Valenciennes	23 May, 1793
Defeated at Dunkirk, 7 Sept. 1793; at Bois le Duc, 14 Sept. ; at Boxtel	17 Sept. 1794
Appointed commander-in-chief	1798
Defeated near Alkmaar	19 Sept. 1799
Resigned	27 Jan. 1809
Again commander-in-chief	1811
