

AUGUSTUS FREDERICK, prince of Great Britain and Ireland, and duke of Sussex, was the sixth son and the ninth child of George III. He was a benevolent, unostentatious prince, taking a deep interest in those questions which had for their object the amelioration of the social condition of the people, promoting political reform, and giving his hearty support to the abolition of the slave-trade. He was twice married; first to Lady Augusta Murray, second daughter of the earl of Dunmore, Scotland, which marriage was subsequently set aside; and secondly, to Lady Cecilia Letitia Buggin (widow of Sir George Buggin), who was created Duchess of Inverness.
