Brabourne, Edward Knatchbull-Hugessen, Lord (b. 1829), politician, sat for Sandwich from 1857 to 1880, when Mr. Gladstone raised him to the peerage. As a commoner he was a Liberal, but in the House of Lords he has generally voted with the Tories. He is the author of several highly popular fairy tales.
