We received your letter today and we hope you had a good Christmas and a merry time, for us it was the same then every day but we had beautiful weather, the last ten days it was just like spring in old Kentucky, warm and a little rain from time to time. When still in bed in the morning, the birds start singing to let us know an other day was coming. Today it turned cooler but we do not expect any frost as it is much dampness in the ground.

We thank you so much for the sheet you and Linn were so kind to send us. We appreciate so much, dear Margo. Our stream berries are fine and soon we will have in quantity if we do not get any frost, it was a very fine season for stage berries but still not have as many were planted then in other years, conditions were so unsettled and then many thought we would not have any sugar to eat them, for all this reasons we expect good prices for the whole season today I got 33¢ a quart, we sold the first quart the 11<sup>th</sup> of December. Yesterday we received a postal card from Ida at Bruffellen she says, she was so glad to receive our card of November 11 - yesterday - and that she wrote us a letter not long ago, but we did not receive that letter and it may be addressed
