The faculty met in regular session, those present being the President, Profs. White, Neville, W. K. Patterson, Kastle Roark, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Nicew, Pence, Brooks, Mackenzie,raig and Capt. Byroade.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Com. on college bulletins.

As chairman of the com. appointed to consider the issuance of a regular college bulletin, Prof. Anderson reported as follows

The Committee appointed to consider the question of issuing State College bulletins in order to take advantage of the second rate postage as provided by law, begs to report as follows:-

It is recommended to the Faculty

- 1st. That twelve bulletins be issued each year; five of these to contain not less than twenty-four nor more than thirty-two pages, one to be the annual catalogue, and six to be in the form of a four page circular, which when folded can be sent out in a number six envelope.
- 2d. That a regular mailing list be prepared containing the names and addresses of persons to whom the small bulletins will be sent every two months.
- 3d. That a committee of three on publication of bulletins be appointed whose duty it shall be to see that the publications are sent out in conformity with the law upon the subject.
- 4th. That every bulletin issued, regardless of its character, shall contain a brief statement indicating all of the courses offered at the State College of Kentucky.
